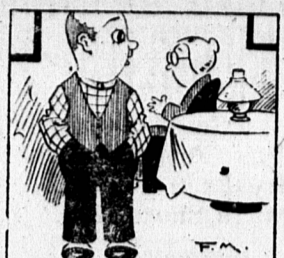

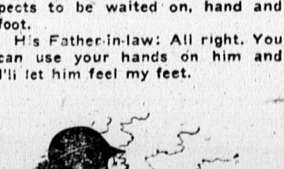

"Is he seeing her?" she asked herself in the mirror. She turned toward the phone on the table and then flung herself down on the bed and lay face down on the pillow.

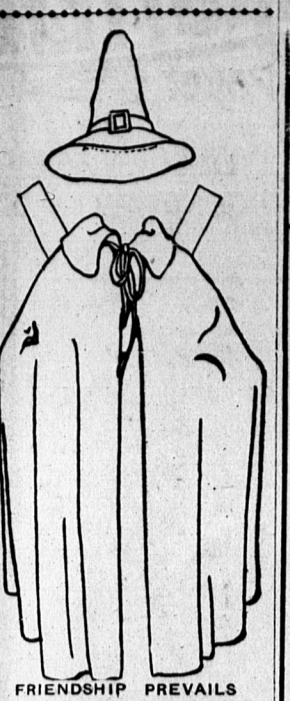
"I'll call him. I've got it," she said, springing suddenly to her feet. She ran to the phone and called Jimmy Rand's number.

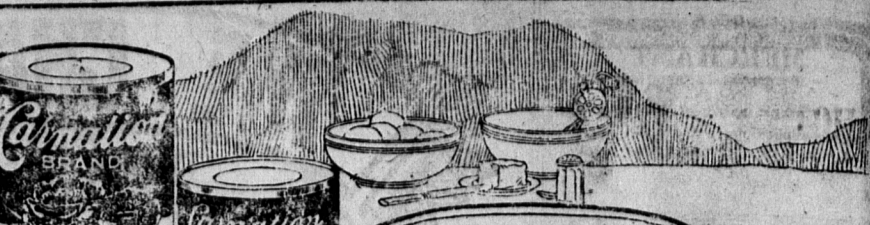

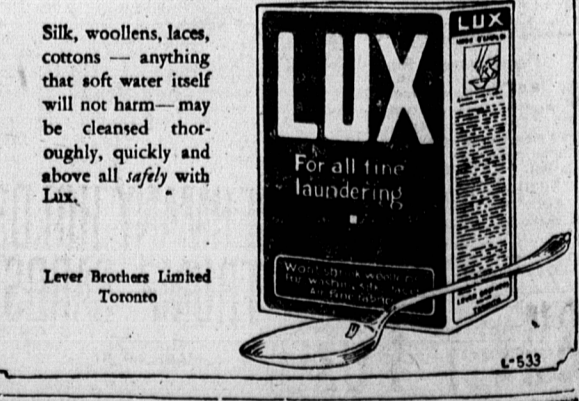
