CIVIL SERVICE REFORM

Much was hoped for in the way of improvement in the civil service when the old-time patronage was abolished and the Civil Service Commission was created by the Union Government some years ago.

As the law now stands, all appointments and the control of all promotions in a civil service numbering some 60,000 persons is entrusted to three men residing at Ottawa.

dozen laborers are needed for any one of the departments in any part of Canada they must be hired from Ottawa.

The civil service of Canada is a most important body entrusted with vast and varied duties, absolutely necessary to the public welfare. They constitute an army whose yearly pay-roll is a mint of money.

The abolition of patronage was called for by the Canadian public. Many members of parliament welcomed the change, as they had found the privilege of recommending appointments to be a burden rather than a boon.
