N.Y. Stocks Quiet, Golds Very Active At Toronto

NEW YORK, April 3 (AP) - Wall Street gave birth to a bull market last week but the baby all but curled up and died. Late Monday the Federal Reserve Board announced that, effective Wednesday, stocks could be bought on a margin of 50 per cent in cash. The news touched off a spurge of buying on Tuesday that gave the market one of the biggest lifts of the last year.

By the week-end the market lost all but a small part of the mid-week advance.

Late in the week gold stocks flared into prominence. Closing at peak prices were Homestake Mining, up 1 5/8 at 41 1/2; McIntyre Porcupine, up one at 17; Sunshine Mining, up 1 1/2 at 9 7/8; and South American Gold and Platinum, up 1-8 at 4 1/8.

Sales amounted to 360,000 shares for the two-hour day, considerable improvement over 240,000 a week ago, which was the slowest Saturday since Oct. 9.

At Toronto

TORONTO, April 3 (CP) - Golds made another strong advance in Saturday's two-hour session of the Toronto stock exchange.

In the exchange's index golds advanced 2.58 points to 102.24, their highest level in more than a year and a gain of 6.09 in two days.

The yellow metals traded over a wide list, with most gains moderate. Ten of the 12 senior producers were traded, all for gains except two which were unchanged.

Dome, Kerr Addison, Lake Shore and McIntyre, all seniors, touched new highs for the year.

Junior golds posting new highs were Akaitcho, Anglo-Rouyn, East Malartic, Howey, Madsen, Malartic, McLellan, Negus and Nicholson.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, April 2 (CP) - A few gold stocks increased their advances while securities generally were improved on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market Saturday.

Dome was a feature in senior golds, up close to \$1 at a new high of \$15.50. East Malartic and Giant Yellowknife also were penny gainers closing at respective new highs of \$245 and \$5.75.

Mining stocks were well traded during the two-hour week-end session, with a total turnover of 68,500 shares against 66,000 a week ago.

Industrial turnover was extremely low at 12,900 shares, a drop of 5,000 shares from the previous Saturday.

Of 118 issues traded, 50 were higher, 29 lower and 37 unchanged. Six new highs and three new lows were established.

Closing averages indicated banks ahead .03 at 27.47; utilities 1 at 73.1 and index 2 at 122.2.

But the best rally from a recent low was displayed by papers and golds. The paper index was up 1.88 at 323.59 and golds jumped 2.03 at 67.65.

The sudden interest displayed by investors for gold stocks was started in late dealings Friday and continued shortly after the opening of the Montreal markets today. It reflected a similar upturn in Toronto and on Wall Street.

WINNIPEG, April 3 (CP) - Allocation of 1,300,000 bushels of Canadian wheat to the United Kingdom and three other countries was reported on the Winnipeg grain exchange Saturday.

The United Kingdom received 550,000 bushels under the Anglo-Canadian wheat agreement. India took 350,000 bushels, China 100,000, and Iran 300,000, all in class two wheat. Prices of class two wheat dropped another two cents today.
