THAT CAR OF YOURS

Very often the parts of a car that get the least attention are subjected to the most strain and wear.

Did you ever consider the number of tons thrust given the front wheels when making a turn at high speed? There is a natural camber to the front wheels when going straight, but upon turning a corner to the right, the left hand wheel is subjected to the immense pressure given by momentum and the weight of the whole car and the passengers.

Does it not then, seem reasonable to give the front wheels and bearings of your car the attention they deserve?

Keep them adjusted and greased.

Ques.—Does the automatic cut-out on a car stop the generator when charging when the battery is full. If not, can it be regulated to do so?

Ans.—The automatic cut-out of a battery is solely to control the output of the generator, and to act as its real name implies—viz;—circuit breaker.

A six volt battery has a six volt pressure, which is connected to a circuit breaker, and six volt generator has upwards of nine volt pressure which is also connected to the circuit breaker.

When the out-put of the generator due to the speed of the engine exceeds six volts, the magnets in the neutral circuit breaker in an electro magnet, which fact closes two points and enables the current from the generator to reach the battery.

When the generator out-put is below six volts, the breaker is demagnetized or neutral and the points open, thus preventing the battery from discharging through the generator. The current cannot be regulated by the cut-out.
