TO TRAIN SCHOOLBOYS.

Great Britain will Probably Introduce Military Training in School.

LONDON Dec 17.—The effective increase of the defensive forces of the country was discussed at the Royal United Service Institute recently when the Rev. C. G. Hall captain-commandant 4th London Volunteer Rifles and head-master of the Troopers' company schools read a paper on "Military Training in Secondary Schools". The lecturer said all thinking Englishmen agreed that it was necessary to adopt a system by which the forces of the Empire might as occasion required be rapidly and effectively increased. Military drill and the use of arms should be, and ought to be taught to boys. The nation demanded it; many school authorities were eager to realize it; the present enthusiasm and sufficient force if utilized at once to make the idea of training every boy in school an accomplished fact. The War

Office had been asked to encourage schools to take their part in the system of national defence and the Government would be asked to supply efficient institutions at reasonable charges. The object was not to make soldiers but to give all boys a military training of such a character so as to enable them to take their place in the ranks in after years with but short preparation. Shooting was important and the Government might be expected to provide both weapons and ammunition on a scale sufficient to ensure real proficiency in all boys of fifteen. Lord Roberts had declared that the training given to boys would make them as efficient for service in after life as was the average reserve when he rejoined the colors. A little hearty encouragement and organization on the part of the War Office were all that was needed to give the nation a great accession of strength.
