Essential vitamins in addition to minerals and other nutrients. Alfalfa meal is good too, and has the advantage that it can be mixed up in the meal mixture for the pigs.

At the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa a feeding practice with the growing and finishing pigs which has given good results is to include five per cent alfalfa meal in the feed mixture or to supply a handful of high quality alfalfa hay to each pig daily. For brood sows, the feeding of alfalfa hay in a rack outdoors not only supplies desirable nutrients but also allows for exercise. Hay, regardless of its quality however, should never be considered as the main part of the ration. While good feeding helps to prevent crippling in winter-fed pigs, it will not be sufficient to correct the trouble after it has developed. For this it is necessary to provide some rich source of vitamin D, and the fish oils—either cod liver oil or pilchard oil—are recommended. The feeding of these oils is also a good preventive against crippling. There are many grades of cod liver oil available, and only one of good feeding quality preferably with a guaranteed vitamin content should be used. As either a preventive or corrective for crippling or rickets a standard oil would be fed at the rate of one tablespoonful per day to each feeder pig. Fortified oils are higher in vitamin content and would, therefore, be fed in smaller amounts.

Vitamins In Winter Pig Feeding

(Experimental Farms News) The lack of three essential factors—exercise, direct sunlight and green succulent feeds—makes the job of raising pigs in winter more difficult than in summer. However, it is possible to grow pigs successfully in winter if suitable methods of feeding and management are adopted. The P. Fraser Division of Animal Husbandry Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, has should include a variety in the grain mixture, the use of mineral and vitamin supplements, and draft-free housing and regular exercise, particularly for brood sows. In addition, there are certain protective feeds which have a special place in winter feeding. In the main these are vitamin-carrying feeds some of which are available right on the farm. Possibly one of the most common troubles encountered in winter pig feeding is crippling. This condition the symptoms of which are stiffness and soreness of the joints, is often caused by rickets, a bone disease. Rickets may result from either a lack of the bone producing minerals calcium and phosphorus, the 'incorrect' proportion of these minerals or insufficient vitamin D for the absorption of these minerals in the body. As intimated the feeding of minerals is essential, and calcium and phosphorus are two of the most important. The feeding of vitamin D is recognized as a corrective for rickets, while it is suggested that a small quantity of this vitamin be supplied at all times as a preventive. Alfalfa and clover hay are valuable in winter pig feeding as these legume hays contain most of the
