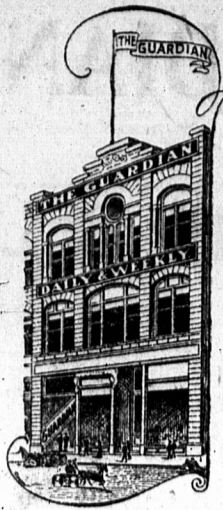

LORD MINTO'S FAREWELL

Lord Minto has said his farewell and closed his official term as Governor General of Canada. He has been with us for something more than six years, having been appointed July 25, 1898. He had then just entered upon his fifty-fourth year. His career had been thus far an almost purely military one. He had entered the Scotch Guards in 1867, was for a short time in Paris during the Commune rising of 1871, acted as war correspondent of the Morning Post during the Carlist rising in Spain in 1874, served as military secretary with the Turkish army on the Danube in 1878, and in the following year on Lord Roberts' staff in the Afghan campaign. In 1881, he went with Lord Roberts to South Africa as Private Secretary. When the Egyptian war broke out in 1882 he was appointed Captain in the Mounted Infantry, and during the struggle was wounded at the action of Hafgar. Later he was made Military Secretary to Lord Lansdowne, then Governor General of Canada from 1883 to 1886 and was Chief of Staff to the late General Middleton during the Riel Rebellion in the Northwest in 1885.

When Lord Minto came to Canada he found the Liberal party pretty firmly seated in power and the principle of a preferential tariff for the Mother Country already adopted. The country was subsequently somewhat agitated over the question of sending a Canadian Contingent to South Africa, and while His Excellency no doubt warmly approved of what was done, it does not appear that he interfered in any way or brought any pressure to bear upon his constitutional advisers in that matter. Without training in political or diplomatic life he seems to have accepted the office of Governor General with all its limitations in a proper official spirit, with the result that his administration has been impartial and free from objection by either party. It is to be observed, however, that there has been during his term of office little temptation to meddle in party affairs. Things have gone smoothly in Canadian affairs and the viceregal term has passed

with the same party in power throughout. Lord Minto's rather uneventful term of office has been one of great progress in the growth and development of Canada. It has also been a period free from any friction between Ottawa and the Colonial Office, and to some extent there has been a drawing together of the Dominion and the Mother Country during the term now ended. It is safe to say that no act of Lord Minto has tended to hinder our national progress, to promote internal discord or to disturb our happy inter-imperial relations. If he has not demonstrated the great or brilliant qualities of a Dufferin or a Lansdowne, Lord Minto has at least administered his high office with courtesy, fairness, wisdom and impartiality. He has won and retained the respect of the Canadian people as a constitutional Governor and a high-minded and patriotic gentleman, and the close of his term found him and Lady Minto holding a warmer place in Canadian hearts than at any earlier period of his stay in our midst.

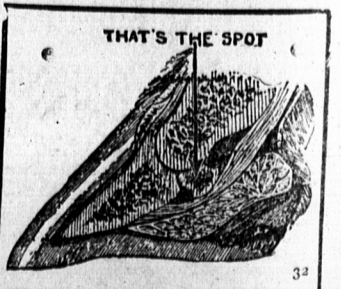
