### BIG GOLD FIND IN ALASKA.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, July 14—Strikes of gold quartz, apparently bearing more than one hundred dollars to the ton, in a district thirty-nine miles south of here, are reported and prospectors are stampeding the area of discovery. Men returning from there said a dozen big fissures of quartz, heavy in gold, had been uncovered within a region twelve by seven miles. The first strike was at Girwood, on the government railroad, according to messages received here and the original find was followed by numerous others of equal importance. Mining men here who have made a preliminary investigation of the discovery predict it would prove epochal. Some of the strikes, they said, developed in the railroad cuts.
