THE OYSTER CULTURE SHOULD BE DEVELOPED

(By J. Bryenton, late of the Fishing Gazette, New York.)

The oyster industry of the Maritime Provinces is capable of being developed beyond any other branch of the fisheries. With laws which would permit the enlistment of capital, the present paltry production of less than \$200,000 annually, would, in five years, increase into millions. In the bays which indent the coast-line of the three provinces along the Strait of Northumberland and the Gulf of St. Lawrence, is a vast arena of the finest oyster producing bottoms in the world. From the extreme north of New Brunswick down the coast to the most easterly point of Cape Breton, as well as in the great bays which beset Prince Edward Island, oyster producing territory abounds, as well as in many of the estuaries in other parts of the province. Here Nature produces unaided, an oyster which excels in favor and commands the highest market price. When the writer was in New York last winter, it came to his notice that the Waldorf Astoria, the finest hotel on the continent, was importing the famous "Malpeques" at a cost of \$22.00 a barrel. When it is remembered that New York is the centre of the oyster industry of the United States, where the celebrated "Blue Points" can be had for seven or eight dollars per barrel, it will be seen that the Canadian oyster must have very superior qualities.

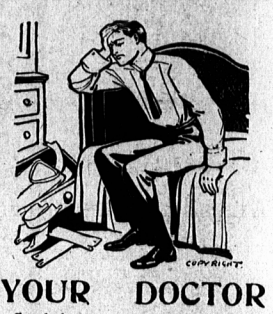
