ENVER PASHA ARRIVES IN CAPITAL OF SOVIET, RUSSIA

Nouri Pasha at Head of Troops now in Baku which was Wrested from the Allies by Soviet Forces Some Days Ago.

(Special to The Guardian) Pasha has moved into Baku, at the head of his troops, together with Soviet forces. The above is the first intimation of actual military co-operation between Soviet and Turkish Nationalist forces. A despatch last Saturday said Baku, the big oil port on the Caspian Sea, had been wrested from the Allies by Soviet forces and that a Soviet government had been established there. Reports of a military alliance between Soviet Russia and the Turkish Nationalists have been frequent of late.

THE FALL OF KIEFF

(Dom. Press Special) LONDON, May 7.—The fall of Kieff is an accomplished fact, the Polish information Bureau today announced. The statement however was accepted with some reserve because of earlier unfounded reports that the Bolsheviks had been driven from the capital of Ukraine. The whole of the Ukraine east of the River Dnieper is rising against the Soviets, the Polish statement said. Individual localities are arming the peasants and refusing to sell provisions to the Bolsheviks.

PROCEEDINGS IN THE PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE

(Continued.) AFTERNOON SESSION MAY 6.

House resumed at four o'clock Hon. Mr. Johnston continuing his address in which he emphasized that everyone who is not too poor or too sick must pay their poll tax. The opposition, he said, did not deny that additional revenue was required, but they did not see how to get it. The only way, he declared, was by direct taxation. It is the intention to have a roll made out and it will contain the names of the tax payer, the valuation of his real and personal property and his income. He claimed their method of taxation would be a fair method, where every man pays according to his wealth. It was a case of lowering the tax on the poor man and the man with the large revenue must pay up. In regard to real estate, he maintained that the farmers were willing to pay generously as long as the public works are kept up. He believed that the farmers as a whole would agree that it was a fair and reasonable measure. He would ask when they would go into committee on the bill to give them the benefit of his experience.

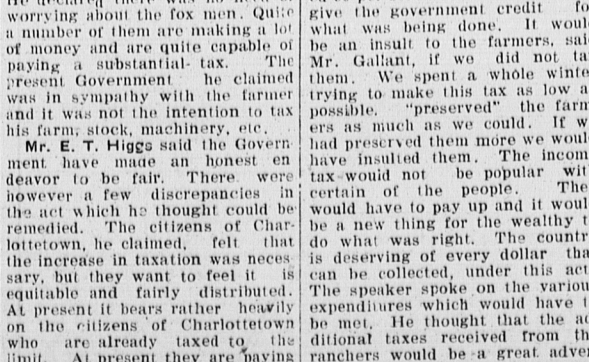

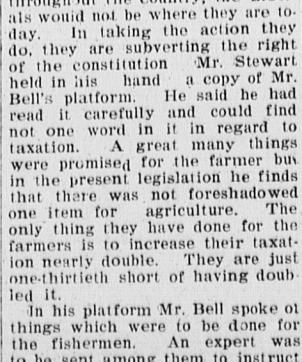

BRITAIN TO IGNORE UNITED STATES SUPPORT

President of Ireland Raising Big Funds in United States on Behalf of Irish Republic. Bonar Law Satisfied with Situation.

(Special to The Guardian) LONDON, May 7.—Britain intends to ignore the unofficial United States support of Eamon de Valera, President of the Irish Republic, Andrew Bonar Law, government spokesman, announced in the House of Commons today. Horatio Bottomley opened a hot interchange on the subject by asking Mr. Bonar Law if the government was aware that De Valera is raising a loan in the United States on behalf of the Irish Republic and that the governors of various American states were supporting De Valera's appeal. The leader of the House of Commons disclaimed knowledge of these alleged facts.

The claims at Ottawa were dealt with in the Liberal manifesto. They had said that if they only had the courage to go up and demand our rights, they would get them. With these obtained they were going to finance affairs of country. If they are honest they will go back and tell the people that they deceived them. Let them tell the people for their decision in this matter. Until they have a mandate from the people, they have no right to proceed in their present course.

Hon. G. E. Hughes said he did not know the state of affairs of the province. The Conservatives should have provided for the teachers. The Liberals always had had an uphill road to travel. He hoped that within a year they would be in a position to pay the teachers what they asked for.

Hon. R. N. Cox said both governments in the past had talked of the claims at Ottawa till the people were tired of the subject. The present government state of affairs would be a business way. As for the promises of the Liberals, said Mr. Cox, for my part I never made any, at least no serious ones.
