BELVASIA MAKES TRACK RECORD

HILLSGROVE, R. I., September 7.—A new trotting track record was established in the third blue ribbon meeting of the season here today when Belvasia, owned by D. W. Clayton, of Foxboro, Mass., negotiated the third heat of the 2.25 stake trot in 2:12.4—the fastest heat ever trotted over the track.

FAST TRAINS ON ENGLISH RAILWAYS.

LONDON, Sept. 7.—English railroads are proud of the speed records on their lines. They boast that they operate a greater number of fast trains at a greater speed than the American railroads.

The fastest non-stop run in England is between Darlington and York. The Northern Eastern road does this in an hour at a speed of 61.7 miles an hour.

The Great Central's expresses cover the 22 1/2 miles between Leicester and Nottingham at the rate of 61.3 miles an hour. The next best run is the Caledonian Railroad's express which covers the 22 1/2 miles from Perth to Perth at 60.9 miles an hour.

The Great Western Railroad has some remarkably fast trains. Its non-stop expresses cover the distance between London and Bristol, 118 1/2 miles, at a speed of 50 miles an hour.

The Great Western also runs non-stop expresses between London and Plymouth, 225 1/2 miles, at a speed of 44.8 miles an hour.

When it runs a special it cuts this figure down under four hours, and once the management of the line offered to make the run in 3 hours and 35 minutes.

CONGRESS OVER AT HALIFAX

Yesterday Was Spent in Windsor And Today They go To Annapolis

Special to The Guardian. HALIFAX, Sept. 8.—The Canadian Anglican Church Congress spent the day at Windsor where the most important feature was the gathering in King's College.

Honorary degrees were conferred on a large number of notable persons including D. C. L. on Mrs. Willoughby Cumming, Secretary National Council of Women. Excursion goes tomorrow to Annapolis Royal, where the first Church of England service in Canada was held 200 years ago.

HALIFAX, N. S., Sept. 7.—The Anglican church congress closed its Halifax meetings tonight. A resolution was passed that a Canadian church congress be held in Toronto five years hence and that the Bishop of Rupert's Land appoint a committee to make arrangements.

This morning, prayer book revision was considered, but on the whole found little favor. At another section of the congress "The Church's Work Among Men" was taken up. The Bishop of Rupert's Land was the chairman. The other side of the question was that in the section where the Bishop of Toronto presided. The topic was "Man's Work in the Church" and the speakers were Canon Robinson and the Bishop of Niagara.

The Weather—After the 25th of July, rain fell on each alternate day in Prince County but in King's County there was only one heavy shower.

Wheat—During the month of August the Joint Worm, Rust and Smut have been doing injury to the wheat crop. The Joint Worm seems to have done much more damage in King's County than in either Queen's or Prince.

Oats—There is not much change to report in the oat crop since July 25th. In the lower lying lands they are injured by the excess of rain during the months of June and July.

Barley—There is not much change to report in the barley crop since July 25th. Two correspondents have reported injury by Cut-Worms cutting the barley off just above the ground shortly before it is ripe.

Potatoes—The potato crop is below average. There was a considerable loss in the crop in the Spring and the Beetles were never worse. The Blight is doing considerable damage in some districts particularly among the early potatoes.
