Pair Escape From Queen's Co. Jail

Lawrence Berrigan, 20, and Robert MacKenzie, 27, escaped from the County Jail yesterday evening and had not been recaptured at a six hour last night.

Berrigan and his elder brother, Walter, had been arrested early Tuesday morning by local R. C. M. P. officers on instructions from the Truro police and had been lodged in the County Jail pending the arrival in Charlottetown today of Truro Police J. W. Fraser who was to escort the two brothers back to Truro to face a charge of burglarizing the store of J. J. Snook, Ltd.

Police authorities were not certain of the means used by Berrigan and MacKenzie in effecting their escape but were of the opinion the men had stolen upstairs and had gained their exit through a gate in the outside fence.

Worker Killed In Blasting Accident

Says Price Control Continues Necessary

HALIFAX, Oct. 10 — (CP) — Prices would rise 25 per cent "almost immediately" if price controls were lifted now, A.F.W. Plummer, secretary of the Prices Board, said today in a Halifax speech.

He said the Board was still a wartime emergency organization, and probably would be retained "perhaps a couple of years or so" depending on the Government's attitude in respect to price control and similar matters.

Gardiner Opposed To Livestock Commission

OTTAWA, Oct. 10 — (CP) — Agriculture Minister Gordon Gordon today in the Commons that if the Federal Government passed legislation establishing a board of livestock commissioners, he would likely be taken by some section of the trade or by the Provinces to have the legislation "put in limbo."

Those who were familiar with the legislation which set up the board of grain commissioners in 1941 was ultra vires of Parliament, but it never had been contested because most of Canada's wheat was marketed outside the country.

Would Eliminate Middlemen
