SENSATIONAL ST JOHN SERMON

Preached Last Night by Rev. R. P. McKim Who Laid the Information in the Recent Abortion Case—A Stirring Denunciation.

St. John, Jan. 14.—(Special)—Rev. R. P. McKim, who first made the information to the police on the Edith Clark abortion case delivered a most sensational sermon here tonight.

BRITISH ELECTIONS GO OVERWHELMINGLY LIBERAL

Profound Sensation Caused by the Defeat of the Late Premier by an Unknown Man—The Liberals Are Meeting With Marvellous Success—Balfour Urges Hard Work.

LONDON, Jan. 14.—(Special)—A profound sensation was caused throughout the United Kingdom on Saturday when it became known that the former Premier, Right Hon. Arthur Balfour had met an overwhelming defeat at the hands of an unknown man.

His opponent was Horridge, Liberal, and the latter's majority was 1800. Saturday's elections have made great changes in the political map of Great Britain and the Liberals are meeting with marvellous success on all sides, having gained already 22 seats.

This change in the early contests is causing widespread comment and the indications are that the Liberals will make even greater wins during the next two weeks.

THUNDERBOLT FOR CONGRESS
