THE PROVINCIAL BANK OF CANADA

Summary of the addresses delivered at the 49th annual general meeting of the shareholders held in Montreal, at the head office of the Bank, 221 St. James West, on January the 11th, 1950.

ADDRESS OF THE PRESIDENT, THE HON. ES.-L. PATENAUDE, P.C., K.C.

Agriculture and social order.—Our prosperity depends on our exports.

Hon. Es. L. Patenaude, recalled at the beginning of his address that 1950 marks an important anniversary, for it was in 1900 that the Provincial Bank of Canada was established.

After a brief survey of the economic situation, he noted that during the past few years a declining trend in agricultural population has been evident, while employment in manufacturing industries has mounted steadily.

Speaking of the problem created by the shortage of American dollars, Mr. Patenaude remarked that our prosperity is dependent in

no small degree on a substantial volume of exports and that the success of the steps taken by our government and our commercial representatives abroad to expand our overseas markets will have a decisive effect on the degree of prosperity we will enjoy in 1950.

Mr. Patenaude observed that property rights are endangered, not only by those who challenge them, but also by those who, though recognizing them, make them illusory through excessive charges. He then gave the following advice: Let us rather strive, he said, to improve our present system. All those who believe in the dignity of man, see in free enterprise and private initiative the surest means of progress—not only material, but also social and personal.

ADDRESS OF THE GENERAL MANAGER, MR. J. U. BOYER

Presenting the 49th annual statement of the Bank, covering the fiscal year ended 30th November 1949, the General Manager, Mr. J. U. Boyer, notes that gross profits for the year amounted to \$718,711, as against \$693,733 in 1948. This compares with \$457,173 in 1939. Net profits amounted to \$307,685, as against \$275,000 in 1948.

The General Manager recalls that the Provincial Bank of Canada has purchased a large building in Quebec City at the corner of de la Couronne Street and Charest Blvd. where it is proposed to open a branch in the near future.

Stocks Stage Minor Rally

By The Canadian Press Stocks, which Thursday nose-dived under selling pressure, staged a last-minute minor rally on the New York Exchange today. Toronto followed Wall Street on the slightly upward trend in late trading with a buying outburst that seemed to bring in check a general losing streak. In Montreal, prices continued to dip although selling was less urgent on the three exchanges today.

The rally was not completed, however, and at the close of trading, losses outnumbered gains 2 to 1. In New York, four times during the day the quotations tpe fell behind actual floor transactions, once by as much as four minutes. In the last hour the buying spirit got under way and erased losses and piled up gains right to the close.
