THE GREAT CANAL.

While the United States is engaged in completing a ship canal across the Isthmus of Panama, British capital is being pledged to the construction of a second ship canal through the isthmus of Suez. De Lesseps, who constructed the existing waterway at Suez also projected and began the larger and costlier work at Panama, but failed to complete the latter and the enterprise ended in financial disaster. The existing Suez canal was constructed in ten years, 1859-69 at a cost of about \$100,000,000. It is about 100 miles in length, 28 feet deep and 120 to 300 feet in width. Steamers, or sail vessels towed by tugs, pass through it in about 24 hours. It has become the highway between Europe and the East, as it shortens the voyage to India by about 7,000 miles as compared with the old route round the Cape of Good Hope.

The reasons why British ship owners and capitalists are very desirous to have a second canal constructed are mainly the excessive tolls charged, amounting to \$2.70 per ton. Of course the canal has a monopoly until a second canal is built. There is a provision in the charter that the tolls shall be reduced when the revenues amount to 25 per cent of the capital cost, but this large revenue has been exceeded for years past and yet no reduction has been made. Shipping people have been so far powerless in the matter as the controlling interest in the canal is owned by the British Government. It is even feared that the construction of a second canal may meet with serious objection on the ground that it would take away revenue from the present canal.

It was claimed, as was pointed out in our despatches, the other day, that a second canal can be constructed, some three miles shorter, with capacity for vessels of larger draft, and in every way a better work, for about one quarter to one third of the cost of the present canal. This would enable the new company to reduce the tolls at least one half and still have a very profitable business. In the end there seems little doubt that by the time the Panama canal is completed, ten or fifteen years hence, there will be a second canal in operation through the isthmus of Suez. It is anticipated that the work of the session will be concluded about the beginning of April, so that the commission can get to work. As the minister of finance and the minister of customs will undoubtedly be on the commission, an investigation cannot go on while the house is in session.
