MARITIME BOARD OF TRADE.

The annual meeting of the Maritime Board of Trade is announced to take place at St. John, beginning on Wednesday evening, 16th August. We trust that a good delegation from the Charlottetown Board may be in attendance. The trip affords a pleasant summer outing and can be taken by delegates at one fare for the round journey to St. John and return.

While any matter affecting the trade, business and industries of the Maritime Provinces may be taken up at the meeting the following subjects have been specially suggested for consideration:—
Preferential Trade within the Empire.
Tourist Travel and the Development of Accommodation for Summer Visitors and their attraction to Points of Interest.
What Can be Done to Attract Desirable Classes of Immigrants to the Maritime Provinces?
Municipal Taxation in the Maritime Provinces.
Shorter Terms of Credit.
The Development of Iron and Steel Industries.
Statutory Conditions for Fire Insurance Policies.
The Increase in Marine Insurance in connection with Canadian Atlantic Ports.
Rates on Freight, on Apples, via Halifax, St. John and U. S. Ports.
Improved Regulations for Passenger and Freight Service on the River St. John.

The construction of an Electric Railway through the Annapolis Valley from Digby or Annapolis to Halifax.
Improved Telegraph Communication between Prince Edward Island and the Mainland.

From the date of the meeting of Parliament on 16th March last to the prorogation yesterday the session covered in all 144 days, a period, but a few days short of five months. If the session continue to lengthen in this way the members of the two houses might as well take up their permanent residence at the federal capital.

The death is announced of Hon. Acaus Lockwood Palmer, a retired Judge of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick and for some years a prominent figure in the politics of that Province. Mr. Palmer in his prime was the greatest lawyer in New Brunswick. He attained his high position at the bar while a resident of Dorchester, when he and the late Sir Albert Smith were engaged on opposite sides in all the great cases before the courts in the eastern section of the Province. He subsequently removed to St. John where he further enlarged his already extended practice. He was for a time the Conservative representative of St. John

County in the Commons and after his defeat was appointed in the Supreme Court. Some years ago he accepted superannuation and more recently returned to practice at the bar and with undiminished success. Within a few months past he won for a client who had been injured by a street car accident a verdict for the large sum of \$25,000. Though this was reduced by the full court on appeal, it stands as high water mark in the records of personal damages recovered for bodily injury in New Brunswick. Strange to say Mr. Palmer afterwards met with a street car accident which eventually caused his death. Judge Palmer was possessed of warm social qualities and an eminently forgiving disposition. His professional income was very large and he spent it with a liberal hand. His only son, Mr. C. A. Palmer, Q. C. died but a few months ago in St. John.

Toledo, Ohio, Aug. 8.—On the evening of Aug. 15, in the middle of the street in front of the Memorial United Brethren Church, this city, the elegantly bound volumes, which compose the library of Marshal O. Waggoner, formerly one of the most pronounced agnostics in the world, will be burned. He was recently converted to Christianity, and made a public declaration of faith a few weeks ago, and became a member of the United Brethren Church. The library in question is valued at several thousand dollars. Nearly every author of any note, who wrote in defence of infidelity and agnosticism, found a place for his works in Mr. Waggoner's library.

WEEDS STOP THE TRAINS.

Vegetation Grows so Rapidly That Trackmen Are Unable to Keep it Properly in Subjection.

Regina, N. W. T., August 7.—The trains on the Prince Albert line of railway have recently been late more often than not; and according to the Prince Albert Advocate, it has been due, partially, at all events, to weeds. This appears rather strange, but it seems that the growth upon the roadbed has this year been so rapid that the trackmen have been unable to keep the road quite clear; the wind blows the weeds over the rail, and they are crushed by the engine, so that the line becomes slippery and the wheels fail to grip. There is not, of course, much traffic by this railway, so the weeds have every chance. The Advocate remarks that a soil which will produce such a crop of weeds in such a place must be particularly rich in plant food.
