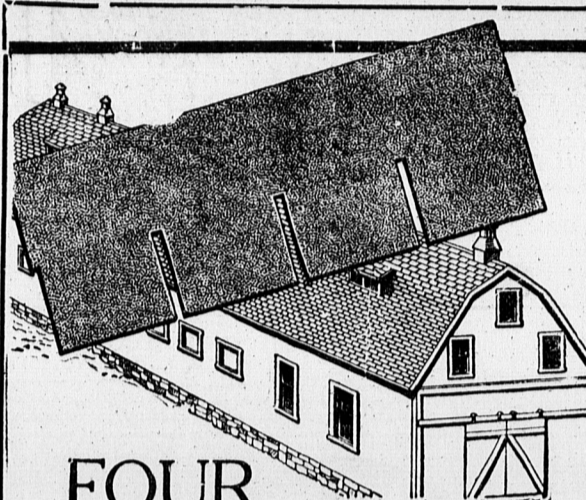

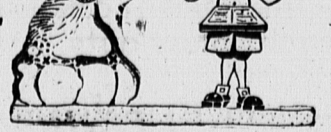

statement at the luncheon which followed. Shipping News

Ten Thousand Ton Steamer Launched With Steam up from British Yard—Built for Italian Parties

NEWPORT, May 10.—The steamship Way Glory, the first of the six ships of over 10,000 tons dead-weight of fabricated type completed by the Monmouth Shipbuilding Company for the Government was launched at Chepstow recently. A bottle of champagne was broken on the bows by Lady Maclay, wife of the Shipping Controller, and sixty-seven seconds after release she majestically took the water as in the manner born, amid the deafening cheers of thousands of onlookers.

NO COAL BOATS FROM NOVA SCOTIA FOR MONTREAL

This season not a ton of coal will be brought to Montreal in the Black Diamond Ships by the water route from Louisburg to Montreal.

When asked when the first shipment of coal was likely to be unloaded in Montreal from Nova Scotia or Cape Breton, a Dominion Coal Company official said: "No coal boats are coming to Montreal this year."

The reasons given were firstly, the great demand made for the coal on the spot by big industries like the Steel Corporation, whose consumption has increased tremendously.

LARGE SCHOONER IN HALIFAX

The four masted schooner Margaret J. Dicks, bound from Norfolk to Italy with cargo of hard coal, put into Halifax Saturday night for repairs to her auxiliary engine. The schooner is commanded by Captain O'Hara, formerly examiner of masters and mates, and a resident of Halifax.

FIRE ON STEAMER NOVIAN AT LIVERPOOL

Fire which originated in the cargo of the British steamship Novian has communicated to the bunker hatches and has not yet been extinguished, according to a message received at Halifax from Liverpool.

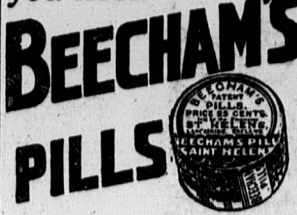
The Novian arrived at Liverpool May 2, from New Orleans.

MACKEREL PLENTIFUL IN SOUTHERN WATERS

The government steamers Hochelaga and Arlex are due to start their mackerel scouting operations at once. These boats will be stationed 30 or 40 miles off Cape Sable and will immediately report to the Barrington wireless the appearance of mackerel schools. The Barrington station will at once distribute the news to Shelburne, Liverpool and other points.

The action of the government in placing these steamers as scouts should result in great benefit to the mackerel fishermen. Halifax has no particular deep sea fishing fleet such as Gloucester possesses, but has a large number of fishermen who own a fleet of gasoline boats, and if they can be notified in time can no doubt be ready to reap the harvest before it passes by. The wireless, however, cannot notify the outlying fishing ports, such as Blandford, Hubbards, Fox Point, Mill Cove, Indian Harbor, etc., unless some special arrangement is or has been made, and if such an arrangement has been made the fishermen appear to know nothing about it.

British Troops Sought Vengeance

CAIRO, May 10.—Hussein Darwish Bey, cabinet minister, was unhurt when a bomb was thrown at the carriage in which he was riding here last night. His driver was wounded and a student nearby was

killed by the explosion. Later a friend of the student was arrested and charged with attempted assassination. British troops went on a brief rampage in revenge for the murder of an officer, but were quiet with little difficulty. In the affray a European, believed to have been an Italian, was killed. The city is quiet, but in a state of nervous-tension.
