THE BRANT.—The D.G.S. Brant yesterday went out and picked up the last of the Bay buoys and brought it in to Charlottetown. This morning she will be engaged in lifting the buoys in the Charlottetown harbor.

PROFITABLE TEA.—The tea and fancy sale which was held in St. Peter's Schoolroom on Wednesday afternoon was largely attended. The magnificent sum of \$300 or thereabouts was realized.

THE D. G. S. MINTO.—The above named steamer is now at Pictou, N. S., whither she proceeded from Charlottetown on Wednesday afternoon, engaged in coaling. She left here at one o'clock and reached Pictou at five in the evening. She will leave Pictou on Saturday for Charlottetown.

THE LADY LAURIER.—Yesterday morning the Dominion Government buoy steamer Lady Laurier left Charlottetown in order to proceed to Magdalen Island to pick up the buoy from North Cape which had broken away a couple of weeks ago and drifted down to the Magdalenes. But the weather became so thick and dirty that the steamer was forced to put in to St. Peter's harbor and seek safe anchorage there for some time.

VICTORIA SHIPPING.—The Schr. Harry B. commanded by Captain Charles Straight, sailed for Sydney on Monday. Her cargo was composed of three thousand bushels potatoes, two hundred bushels oats and tons hay.—The Schr. Minnie, Captain Tremblin in charge, left port Tuesday, for Sydney. She had on board seventeen hundred bushels potatoes, seven hundred bushels oats, twelve hundred bushels turnips and six hundred bushels vegetables.—The Schr.
