

**CABLE LETTER SERVICE IS EXTENDED TO CUBA**

TORONTO, March 1.—The G. N. W. Telegraph Co. announces that the cable letter service, which has been in effect between Canada and the principal European countries for several months, will, on March 1, be extended to Cuba. Cable letters for points in Cuba will be accepted either in the English or Spanish language, and will be delivered within twenty-four hours. Between points in the Province of Ontario and Quebec and Havana a charge of \$1.50 will be made for a minimum of twenty words, and \$c. for each additional word. From points in Manitoba to Cuba the minimum rate will be \$1.75 for twenty words, the extra word rate being the same as in Eastern Canada. To interior points in Cuba a slightly higher rate than the above will be charged.

**RE CANADIAN VENEZUELAN ORE CO.**

Since the return of F. P. Jones from Venezuela a considerable amount of definite information with regard to the progress and prospects of this Company is available. A very thorough technical report on the physical aspects of the property has been made by Henry Adams, the Mining Engineer of the Company, the gist of which is, that No. 1 and No. 2 veins are strong and continuous and have been proved to water level. These veins are, as originally estimated, about 8ft. thick. At the west end there is an immense showing of ore, the vein being 200ft. or more wide, so that this part of the property will be worked by steam shovel. Above water level there are, at a conservative estimate, at least 20,000,000 tons of ore, and undoubtedly very much more below that level. difficulty in working below water level, but it will be a long time before this becomes a practical issue.

There is no difficulty whatever in disposing of the ore, and all the parties to whom it has been shipped are very pleased with it and ready to give repeat orders. It would be possible now, by signing long contracts for boats at the prevailing high rates, to ship at once very large quantities of ore at prices that would show a net profit of about a dollar a ton, but this is not considered good policy and at present the company will go along quietly shipping from 12,000 to 15,000 tons a month, the profit from which will be more than enough to pay all expenses, and fixed charges. Before the end of the year it is fully expected that additional vessels will be available on better terms, and that a considerably higher rate of profit will be made.

The attitude of the Venezuelan Government is most friendly. That country is now being opened up for development purposes, and every encouragement given to foreign capital. As the Venezuelan Government receives a royalty of 20c. a ton on all ore shipped, it is obvious that it will have a substantial interest in the development of the Company. The plant is being equipped to a full shipping capacity of one million tons of ore per annum.

**FINNISH RUNNER FAILED TO BEAT RECORD OF ALF SHRUBB.**

BUFFALO, March 3.—Hannes Kolehmainen, the world's amateur champion long distance runner, won an hour's race from George Richards and James Duffy, the Canadian runners, who ran half an hour each, leading Duffy by one and one-twelfth laps at the end of the hour. The wonderful Finnish runner was out to beat the world's record of 11 miles and 1,187 yards, made by Alf Shrubbs, the English runner in 1904. He failed, however, running 11 miles and 485 yards. The Canadian runners were given an ovation by the crowd, which numbered 7,000.

**ABERDEEN TO RESIGN LORD LIEUTENANCY OF IRELAND.**

LONDON, March 3.—The Earl of Aberdeen has decided to resign the lord lieutenancy of Ireland, which he has held since December, 1906, according to a report published today in The Globe. He will probably be succeeded by Baron Ashby St. Ledgers, a cousin of Winston Spencer Churchill, first lord of the admiralty.

**BLACK FOX MANGLED.**

PORT ELGIN, March 2.—A black fox in the pen of W. M. Spence had the misfortune to get one of his feet caught in the wire and became considerably mangled. The result was that the foot had to be amputated by Dr. H. R. Carter. It is doing well at present.

**MORE ABOUT THE PANAMA DISPUTE.**

BOGOTA, Columbia, Mar. 1.—The Columbian government publishes a statement in full of the negotiations between it and the United States for the settlement of the dispute over the partition of Panama. The statement says Columbia has refused the following informal propositions made by the United States: First—The payment of \$10,000,000 for coaling stations on the Islands of Andres and Providencia and an option for a canal by way of the Atrato River. Second—The good offices of the United States in the settlement of the boundary and other questions with Panama. Third—Arbitration of reversionary rights in the Panama Railroad. Fourth—Preferential rights on the Panama Canal.

**BANK ROOPER CAPTURED**

ATLANTA, Ga., March 1.—M. Harris, alias P. Montague, was identified here last night by private detectives as one of the men reputed to have been connected with the robbery of the Bank of Montreal at New Westminster, B. C., of \$272,000, according to a police announcement. Harris also is believed to be one of the men who attacked Police Lieut. Bernard J. P. Burns in a Chicago saloon last September. The authorities say the identification of the accused men here was made by photographs and Bertillon measurements. Harris was being held by the police here in connection with the attempted robbery of a bank at Dahleonega, Ga., recently.

**DR. CONNELL LEAVES QUEEN'S**

KINGSTON, Feb. 28.—Principal Gordon of Queen's University received the resignation of Dr. J. C. Connell, dean of the faculty of medicine. Dr. Connell was appointed dean in 1893 and is a graduate of Queen's, both in arts and medicine. A deputy from the faculty asked him to reconsider his resignation, but he declined. He will remain in Kingston and devote all his time to his own practice.
