THE RUSSIAN LAND QUESTION.

Count Tolstoi in an article contributed to the London Times asserts that the land question lies at the bottom of the unrest, and suffering in Russia.

The union of Russian peasants recently assembled at Moscow asked not only for universal suffrage and a national Parliament with full powers, but also for the surrender of the national and ecclesiastical domains to peasant proprietorship.

The right of the people to the land on which they were born and which they and their forefathers have tilled for generations is denied them. This is declared by Count Tolstoi to be the fundamental evil from which the Russian people suffer.

land-slavery in which they are now held,

can render political reforms not a plaything and a tool for personal aims in the hands of politicians, but the real expression of the will of the people.

One need only enter into the unceasing sufferings of millions of the people; the dying out from want of the aged, women and children, and of the workers from excessive work and insufficient food—one need only enter into the servitude, the humiliations, all the useless expenditures of strength, into the deprivations, into all the horror of the needless calamities of the Russian rural population, which all proceed from insufficiency of land—in order that it should become quite clear that all such measures as the abolition of censorship, of arbitrary banishment, &c., which are being striven after by the pseudo-defenders of the people, even were they to be realized, would form only the most insignificant drop in the ocean of that want from which the people are suffering.

PUBLIC OPINION IN JAPAN.

Public opinion in Japan as expressed by the newspapers urges the continuation of the war unless Russia agrees to the Mikado's terms. Japan is a constitutionally governed country in which public opinion has much weight.

Great Britain has won a measure of good-will from the Spanish people by granting military honors to the remains of sailors of the Spanish Armada who went down with their ship in Tobermory Bay over three centuries ago.

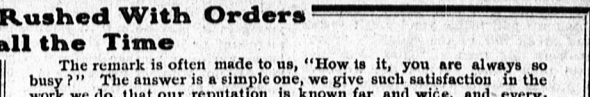
