Papers Stronger On Montreal Mart.

MONTREAL, June 5—(CP)—Selected papers were stronger on the stock exchange and curb market today while the balance of the list was quiet and narrow in continued dull trading. Total volume was 121,400 shares.
In papers Price extended its upward trend again today, adding 2 3-4 at 58 7-8. Consolidated gained 1-4 and Abitibi Preferred 1-4. Abitibi Pfd. was shaded. Molson increased 1-4 and Walker was 3-8 better in Alcohols, while Canadian Breweries lost the same amount. International Bronze climbed 1 3-4 in industrials but Rand slipped 1-4. In C and E. was up 5 cents and Homestead 1. McColl lost 5-8. McDonald tumbled 28 cents in mines and Consolidated Central Cadillac lost a cent.
Trading box score: Stocks traded 161, higher 37, lower 56, unchanged 68, new highs 2, new lows 4.

Leaders Continue To Stumble At N. Y.

NEW YORK, June 5 (AP)—Selected stocks crawled into the plus column of today's market although many leaders continued to stumble in one of the slowest sessions of the past year.
The ticker tape dozed throughout. A mild midday buying flurry was shortlived. While gains of fractions to a point or so remained at the close, declines of as much as 100 shares compared with \$20,000 Thursday. They equalled those of last Monday which were the smallest for a 5-hour stretch since July 5, a year ago.
Distillers closed up 1-4 among Canadian issues while Canadian Pacific, off 1-8 at mid-day closed unchanged. Dome Mines also was unchanged. On the curb, Lake Shore lost 1-4.
Pere Marquette Preferred added 3-4 at 93 1-2 and the Prior Preferred 3 at 114 on word the road's merger with Chesapeake & Ohio would go through following a federal court refusal to grant a temporary injunction. Transactions in both issues were meagre.
Pacific Western Oil was up 1-8 at 35 and Union Pacific 1-2 at 130. Lesser improvements were shown for Republic Steel, Woolworth, Douglas Aircraft, United Aircraft, Glenn Martin, Eastern Air Lines, American Telephone, Westinghouse, Union Carbide, Philip Morris, General Electric, Texas Pacific Land Trust, Celanese, Texas Co., Southern Pacific and Great Northern.
Chesapeake and Ohio lost 1-8 at 42 3-8 and U. S. Gypsum 1 at 34. Fractional casualties included U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, Chrysler, Goodrich, Goodyear, Sears Roebuck, Montgomery Ward, International Harvester, Anaconda, Kennecott, American Can, Johns-Manville, Santa Fe, Southern Railway and Northern Pacific.
Standard Oil (NJ) pushed up to a new 1947 peak in the morning but eventually slipped and finished off 1-4 to 72 1-2.
