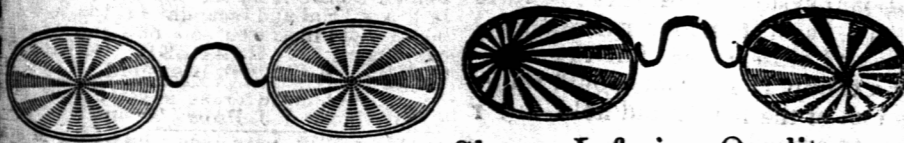

CITIZENS INDIGNANT.

One of Their Number Takes His Whiskey and Starts for Charlottetown.

For the last few months Montague Village was comparatively quiet very few people to be seen under the influence of liquor, and as the old offender, Eliza Campbell was recently fined for a second offence and Prosecutor Bears on her track for a third offence, she was naturally careful. They were in hopes that they were nearly clear of the evil but within the last few days and nights it became evident that there was a change. Boys and men were seen reeling about the streets, and night was made hideous with their noise and shouting. Enquiry revealed the fact that two strangers, whom no person seemed to know, had opened a den on one of the back streets, and on Wednesday morning about forty of the most respectable citizens walked into their establishment, caught them in the act of dealing out the poison, gave them to understand that they were not going to allow them, or anybody else to conduct a business of that kind in their midst, gave them notice if they did not leave the village in twenty-four hours (which they promised to do) the consequence would be serious.
