New Treatment For Tuberculosis

(By Dominion News Service) LONDON, Aug. 18.—A new treatment for consumption has been discovered, and many of the larger London hospitals are already experimenting.

"The treatment is by the injection of a vaccine composed of dead tubercle bacilli" said an official at the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Heart and Lungs yesterday. "These are prepared in such a way as to increase their effectiveness in setting up resistant condition in the patient. The bacilli have not been previously able to produce increased resistance owing to their being surrounded by a fatty tissue, but this capsule has now been removed by Professor Dreyer's special preparation."

Experiments in the above hospital are confined to certain carefully selected cases, which have been in the hospital four or five weeks and have not reacted to any other form of treatment, and are now under very careful supervision. If any improvement takes place, it may be regarded as a proof of the success of the new treatment.

The new vaccine is not yet on the market, but it shortly will be. In the case of the City of London Hospital, prompt use has been made by the hospital's own medical staff. The London Hospital is also applying the treatment and a few cases are being treated at the Brompton Hospital and the New End Hospital, Ealing.

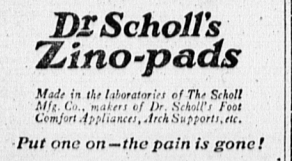

Canada's High Commissioner In London Kept Busy

LONDON, Aug. 17.—Frank Ed High Commissioner for Canada, who arrived in Ottawa a few days ago to report to the Canadian Government the results of his work in London since he was appointed High Commissioner, has been able to settle many questions, has improved Canada's position, and in a quiet unostentatious way has made many friends for the Dominion.

For 28 years there had existed an embargo on Canadian cattle entering Great Britain. The story of the embargo of the Canadian cattle was not only unjust but a blemish on the good name of Canadian livestock needs no repetition, as is well-known. After the war Canadian Ministers in London were given a definite promise that this embargo would be removed, but great opposition was roused among the agricultural interests in England and Scotland and the British Government continued to evade the issue. Then the United States Government imposed the Fordney Tariff which made it almost impossible to export Canadian cattle to the American market at a profit. It was necessary that something should be done and done quickly. Six or eight months after Mr. Larkin arrived the embargo was removed and Canadian cattle are now being landed at British ports every week.

The next difficulty that faced Mr. Larkin was the settlement of the Rumanian Loan. After the war Canada advanced to Rumania \$20,000,000. The Rumanian Government for four years did not pay a cent of interest or principal. Mr. Larkin's long business experience, coupled with a friendly but firm attitude, resulted in an arrangement by which the first \$5,000,000 interest on this loan was paid a few months ago. The agreement with Rumania, insures the regular payment of interest in the future and the ultimate discharge of the debt. At Mr. Larkin's suggestion an export tax was placed on all shipments of Rumanian grain. The proceeds of this tax are sent to the bank of England in payment of interest and to provide a sinking fund for the loan.

The Greek Government also appealed to Canada for financial assistance after the war and 7,000,000 dollars were loaned. No payments have been made by the Greek Government but it is now announced that a quarter of a million dollars interest is to be paid immediately and a pledge has been given that all further interest payments will be made promptly in the future. A portion of the proceeds of the first loan floated by the Greek Government will be devoted to the discharge of this debt to Canada.
