few years ago. Every year developments are made which makes living easier and more profitable in the garden province of Canada. And the greatest boon of all is coming in a short time in the car-ferry. This will give Prince Edward Island opportunities it has not hitherto enjoyed. It will place us in practically continuous communication with the rest of the great world. It will be a boon to traders and farmers and stimulate activity along industrial lines. Easier facilities for shipment all the year round should lead to the establishment of more industries, and more industries means employment for more people and more money put in circulation.

Then there is the tourist trade. This ought to be catered to more than it has been. We have a delightful summer climate and the most hospitable people in the world. But a good climate and a hospitable people are not all that is essential to a successful tourist business. If the better class of tourist travel is to be catered to extensively arrangements must be made to care for them while here. The hotel accommodation we now have for summer visitors is excellent, but it is limited. Frequently visitors to our shores cannot get accommodation and leave after stopping a few days whereas their intention was to remain some weeks or perhaps months. This is a condition which must be met and wiped out if an energetic propaganda for tourists is to be successfully inaugurated. It ought to be an easy matter to do this and if it is done the investment should be a profitable one.

The successful promotion of these matters calls for an expenditure of money. This expenditure must take the form of publicity abroad. A merchant with goods to sell uses printer's ink to make the fact known and let the public know what he has to offer. If it is desirable that Prince Edward Island should have more capital to develop its resources industrially and otherwise; that the people who left the province when conditions here were not as good as they are now should be brought back; that the attractions of the province should be set out with a view to bringing in tourists, money must be spent to make the facts known. Intelligent publicity is highly essential to the proper presentation of the case for Prince Edward Island.

The writer believes that a man with an expert knowledge of the various methods of publicity stationed in Boston to bring industrial and other conditions here before the people of the New England States and other parts of the republic to the south of us would earn his salary and expenses many times over. A bureau of information in Boston under competent management would assuredly be a great asset for Prince Edward Island. Great changes are taking place here. Conditions are being improved in many ways. Why not let the outside world know of these things? If this were done more money would come into the province, and with it would come more people. And we need both just now.

SAND CUT TROLLEY WIRES

Extending from Cairo to the Pyramids of Gizeh is an electric trolley line which is used chiefly by tourists, says The Electrical World. The trunks of huge palm trees serve as trolley poles to support the overhead conductor, and the contrast between the modern hurrying motor cars and the peaceful centuries-old tombs of the Pharaohs holds the interest of many a contemplative traveller. At one side of the trolley conductor on bell-shaped insulators are run the feeders, which, like the trolley wire, are of bright, hard-drawn copper. After these wires had been installed it was soon found that they invariably broke and fell within six or seven months, the cross-section being much reduced at the point of fracture. Investigation showed that the desert winds which sweep across the right-of-way whip sand particles against the wires, causing a filling action which cuts away the copper much like an artificial sand blast. The glass globes of arc lamps installed along the road have exhibited the same destructive action. A similar effect is observed with the incandescent units used to light the way to the Sphinx. These strings of lamps, besides having to be moved at frequent intervals to accommodate the varying level of the shifting sands, are rapidly eaten away by the etching action of the desert winds. Thus far no remedy has been discovered for this destruction except frequent renewals.
