EIGHT BOATS LOST IN LAKE

BURLINGTON, Vt., November 13—Eight lake boats, a part of the tow of the tug Defender, were lost in the storm which swept over Lake Champlain Friday night, Saturday and Sunday. Two of them are at the bottom of the lake, a third was wrecked beyond repair and five others are ashore in dangerous positions just north of Colchester reef. The Defender was on her way south from Rouses Point with 30 boats, loaded with lumber and hay, in tow. During the night Friday she ran into a gale and sought refuge in the lee of Providence Island. The crews all escaped, although some had difficulty in doing so.
