The plant for this work also arrived by the steamer yesterday. The work is to be carried on in conjunction with the firm of Clark Bros. of Mount Stewart. An arrangement is being made by which the berries will be placed on the American market in perfect condition. The same Boston firm have plants installed at various other places for the packing of other kinds of fruit.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
PETROGRAD, August 6—The official statement from General Headquarters, issued to-day, reads: "The battles along the Sereth, south of Brody are developing in our favor. Our troops after consolidating their position on the right bank of the river captured two more villages by assault and part of a wood situated southeast of one of them and a height situated between the two. Especially heroic fighting occurred in the villages, where it was necessary to drive the enemy out of nearly every stretch. The enemy made nine counter-attacks from the neighboring woods. All these were repulsed and the enemy suffered heavy losses. Over 400 men were taken prisoner and fresh prisoners continue to arrive. The situation in the Caucasus remains unchanged."
