The House of Commons now being elected in the United Kingdom will contain 670 members, that being the number established by law since 1855. Of these England elects 435; Wales 30; Scotland 72, and Ireland 103. In the last general election held in July 1895 there were 411 Members and 29 Opposition members elected, giving a Ministerial majority of 152. This large majority was wholly obtained in England alone, which returned 349 Government supporters, and only 116 in Opposition, the Ministerial majority in England being 237. Wales returned an Opposition majority of 14, Scotland 6 and Ireland 61. The Conservative-Unionist party led by Lord Salisbury is now what it was then, mainly an English party, so far as its support in the Commons is concerned. In all over 6,600,000 electors are entitled to take part in a general election, the proportion of electors to each member of Parliament being 9,851. On an average there is a population of 60,537 per member.

We are informed that not only is there unlawful sale in the liquor saloons after hours, but that in one notorious case a bar is kept open within a basement while the proprietor's license covers only a room on the street level. Then it is well known that the anti-treating clause of the License Act is openly violated every day. When the law was first brought into operation a few persons were prosecuted and fined for treating. Now we hear no more of the matter. It is simply too much to believe that that the Inspector does not know that unlawful treating is going on. If no effort is to be made to enforce the penalties of the law when justly incurred, it must give color to the prevalent impression that the repeated violations of the Act are simply being winked at and condoned by the authorities. THE GUARDIAN dislikes continuous fault-finding, but if no better effort is made to enforce the law than is apparent at the present time the subject must be brought before the public in a very emphatic way in the near future.

DREYFUS STIRS A ROW.

Writes of His Intent to Wipe Out the Rennes Trial.

PARIS, Sept. 29.—The letter from ex-Capt. Alfred Dreyfus, thanking Senator Trardieux for his kind words on the occasion of the anniversary of the closing of the Rennes trial, establishes the fact that Dreyfus intends to fight to the bitter end for a legal revision of his trial. The anti-ministerial organs seize this occasion to accuse the government of countenancing anything pertaining to the Dreyfus case in spite of the present unpopularity of the affair which has been so harmful to general commercial interests.

It is extremely doubtful, however, if the Dreyfus case will now prove as good a weapon to them as it has been in the past.
