OTTAWA, March 18 (CP)—Dr. F. W. Gray of Sydney, N. S., Assistant General Manager of Dominion Steel and Coal Corp., said today before the House of Commons Committee on reconstruction and re-establishment that Nova Scotia is looking to Ontario as a post-war market for coal.

"The people of Ontario, and particularly of Toronto, have been very cooperative in using Nova Scotia coal," said Dr. Gray. "Many have had new furnaces altered to burn our coal. I'm sure they will buy it again when the war is over and it is available.
