A number of incidents occurred last Sunday while the fog obscured the shipping in the harbor, which, owing to the dense curtain of mist were not learned of at the time. It is rarely that such thick fog is experienced here, and several boats which essayed trips to and from this city became enveloped in the gloom and lost all bearings. John Lund, who left St. Peter's Island early on Sunday morning to come to Charlottetown in his boat spent nearly all day on the trip, and in the afternoon not having any idea where he was, was glad to learn from another boat which almost came aboard him that he had made the harbor all right. A boat's crew, which started from this city for up of the river, to their oyster fishing grounds, sailed on, and on, on for some hours and finally brought up at the black buoy off Victoria Park. Two of the members of the crew very nearly met death in the quiet waters of the harbor. They left their boat and embarking in their punts put off to a schooner which was dimly discernible, near at hand. Before fully accomplishing the trip however the punts capsized and its occupants were thrown into the harbor. They gave utterance to lusty howls which were heard even so far away as H. M. S. Cornwall from which a launch was sent to investigate. Before the blue-jackets arrived on the scene however the rescue had been made by a man on the schooner who threw a rope overboard and the strugglers in the water being fortunately within range, were hauled aboard. Had it not been for the fact that they were so close to the schooner there would doubtless have been a drowning to record as the men were heavily clothed and had been quite a time in the water.

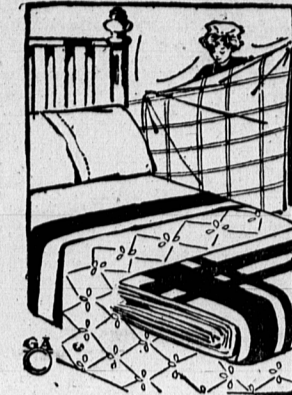

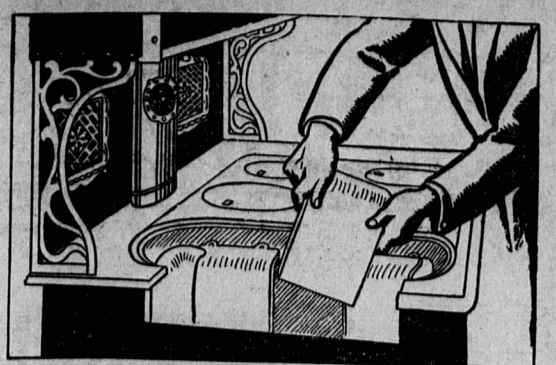
