London and return, he had spent
more than a thousand dollars of
provincial revenue, or about twenty-
five dollars a day, while over
there.

Prohibition Enforcement
Coming to the administration of
the Prohibition Act by the At-
torney General, Mr. Mathieson
charged that this system was both
extravagant and unwise.

RIGHT OF APPEAL
Continuing, Mr. Mathieson cited
the pledge in the Conservative
platform to restore to the people
the right of appeal to the Courts,

An Opiulant "Count"
"That," continued Mr. Mathieson,
"was not enough. The next man
hired was the famous Belgian
Count, Hubert, I wouldn't call
him a 'Count' in the performance
of his duties—he was an Oriental
Prince in the way he lived
at the expense of the taxpayers of
the Province (Laughter).

FISHERMEN'S RELIEF
"I am sure," continued Mr.
Mathieson, "that no one appreciates
the position of our needy
fishermen more than Dr. MacMillan
does. One of the planks of
his platform is that fishermen's
relief will be given under proper
supervision, and fishermen's loans
administered on a proper basis.

An Appalling Statement
"Here is an undoubted viola-
tion of this principle in the legis-
lation passed by this Govern-
ment, and I maintain that when
the Attorney General makes these
statements of law in defence of his
legislation, he is misleading the
people.

And it would be difficult for
the Government to get a single witness
to give evidence against the
landowners. I submit that this is
encouraging a contempt for law
and a contempt for our Courts. It
makes out our Government attor-
neys to be incompetent. It makes
out our Judges to be fools, and it
MAKES OUT OUR FARMERS TO
BE PERJURERS. I never heard
such an invidious charge made as
to our courts of justice before.

MR. WADE HUGHES
The brevity of Mr. Hughes' re-
mark was one of the surprises of
the meeting. He said he did not
propose to review the Govern-
ment's record or election platform,
as "the man best capable of doing
this is the Conservative Govern-
ment. On the other hand there
were several men in this hall
who received fishermen's loans from
this Government."

MR. D. M. MACLEAN
Applause greeted Mr. D.M. Mac-
Lean, who followed Mr. Hughes at
the meeting, when he scored the
Government's action in calling the
election at this unseasonable time.

Fish Houses
"This Government," he contin-
ued, "built fish houses around this
shore for the use of the fishermen.
In one instance that I know of,
the fishermen applied to Mr. Le-
gatte for the use of the building
and they were denied it, and the
only way they got use of that
building was by applying to the
Marine and Fisheries Department
at St. John's."

MR. SAVILLE'S APOLOGY
Mr. Saville, who was the first
speaker at the meeting, said he
wished to discuss the questions at
issue in a broad way. He was
seeking re-election on two grounds:
the record of Liberalism so far as
Georgetown was concerned, and his
own record during the past five
years. He could not recall any-
thing the Conservatives had done
for Georgetown except build the
first ferry boat on the Cardigan
river; whereas everything Geogetown
had asked for had been granted
by the Campbell Govern-
ment, he said. He cited road work.

MR. SAVILLE'S APOLOGY
Mr. Saville, in the time allowed
him for rebuttal at the close of
the meeting, talked to a hall only
audience walked out, several tell-
ing him to "sit down."
