M. D. 6 Maintains Best Army Record

While figures of active personnel in M.D. 6 served during our Pacific are not yet available, the statistics are reported to be mounting rapidly at District headquarters.

Announcement of general enlistments and conversions from N.R.M.A. to active service in M.D. 6 in recent months followed the above release. Up-to-date statistics are expected shortly showing the active service enlistments in this province in relation to those of other provinces in the Dominion.

In addition to the 2,200 men shown Nova Scotia and 45 age group in the Canadian Army, Prince Edward Island and British Columbia for the first place, Prince Edward Island, which is also in M.D. 6, tied with British Columbia with 471 personnel.

A splendid proportion of these soldiers in the province in M.D. 6 in Canadian divisions overseas, the remainder in Canada and the Kingdom, and the proportion of them will represent their province in the Pacific.

Another record has been established in the enlistment of P. I. in the Dominion of Canada. According to latest figures no district in Canada has equalled the number of enlistments in the Dominion of Canada in relation to the number of population within the age limits of 18 to 45.
