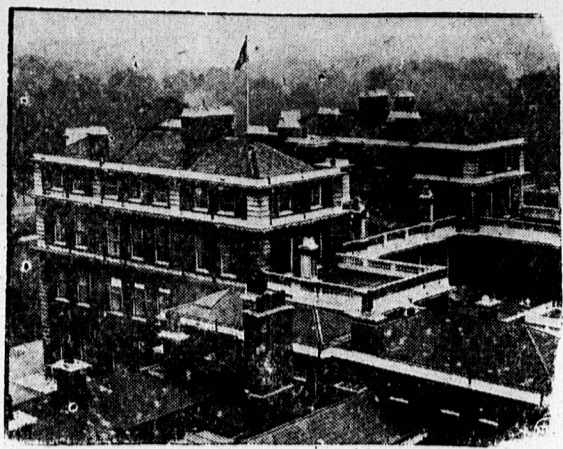

LONDON, Nov. 9.—The widowed Queen Mary is now comfortably settled down in Marlborough House the traditional home of widowed Queens of England. It was immediately after the funeral of King George that it was announced that Queen Mary would move into Marlborough House as soon as necessary repairs could be completed.

Cost \$250,000 Originally
Marlborough House is one of the handsome red brick buildings conceived by the great Sir Christopher Wren, architect of St. Paul's Cathedral. It was built in 1709 in the palmy days of that great General Churchill, who became First Duke of Marlborough. His wife, the celebrated Sarah, wanted the house as close to St. James's Palace as possible, right near "Neighbor George," as she called the sovereign. It cost \$250,000—a tremendous price in those days. Many years later when it was bought for the Crown, the price was one million dollars. The Duchess lived there long after her husband died. In fact, until her own death in 1744.

House Antique Collection
For her it has always seemed more like home than Buckingham Palace or Windsor Castle or Balmoral. It is smaller and more comfortable. Many of the carpets, curtains and hangings of crimson which were in place 26 years ago when she lived there, were put in storage when she moved to Buckingham Palace. They have now been put back into use, being practically as good as new. Being more home-like, one of the four acre garden right in the heart amenities of the place is its lovely

BE HAND IN GLOVE WITH FASHION
What's new in that very important accessory, gloves? To hit the high spots, it's glace kid and color. Glace kid this year has graduated to the rank of a high fashion and is definitely among the smart leathers to be considered. Color carries on with an even wider acceptance than last spring and the colors are so subdued and ladylike that the most conservative among us can wear them with out hesitation. USE ORANGE RIND AS A FLAVORING FOR COOKIES
A mixture of two tablespoons of sugar and a teaspoon of grated orange rind, sprinkled over sugar cookies, gives them an unusual flavor. Another variation is to cut the dough in two-inch squares, spread with marmalade fold and press together. By dividing the dough and flavoring it differently, you can thus make several kinds of cookies from a single recipe.
LILY OF THE VALLEY IS DAINTIEST INDOOR BULB
Few flowers are as easy to flower indoors as the dainty lilies-of-the-valley. There are easy to grow, sure to bloom and lend themselves to attractive table and sun-parlor decorations. In nature it is a spring flower, but by development of cold storage methods it has come to be an all-season bloom. The roots, or pips as they are commercially called, are held dormant until such time as they are wanted to bloom.
Lily of the valley roots, potted from the garden, allowed to freeze, and then brought into a window, will proceed to send out their spikes of snowy, fragrant bells in short order. The only requisite to be sure of blooms is that a blooming sized pip is planted, the bud being already formed and dormant in the pip. While roots can be dug from the garden, it is much easier and more certain to buy the prepared commercial pips. They are sold cheaply and are so certain to bloom that it is hardly worth while to dig them from the garden. One month from potting to bloom is all that is required in growing cold storage pips, and you can procure them any time during late fall any winter.
Most sphagnum moss in a bowl is a fine growing medium. When they are brought from cold storage the preliminary freezing needed, or roots dug from the garden is unnecessary. You simply plant them and in the course of a month or less they are in bloom. About twenty-five pips in a good sized bowl, say about 7 inches across, will give a beautiful display. Plant in moss, fiber or soil, keep shaded until well into growth and then bring to the light.
They can be grown in soil in an ordinary flower pot most easily of all. Planted in November, they will

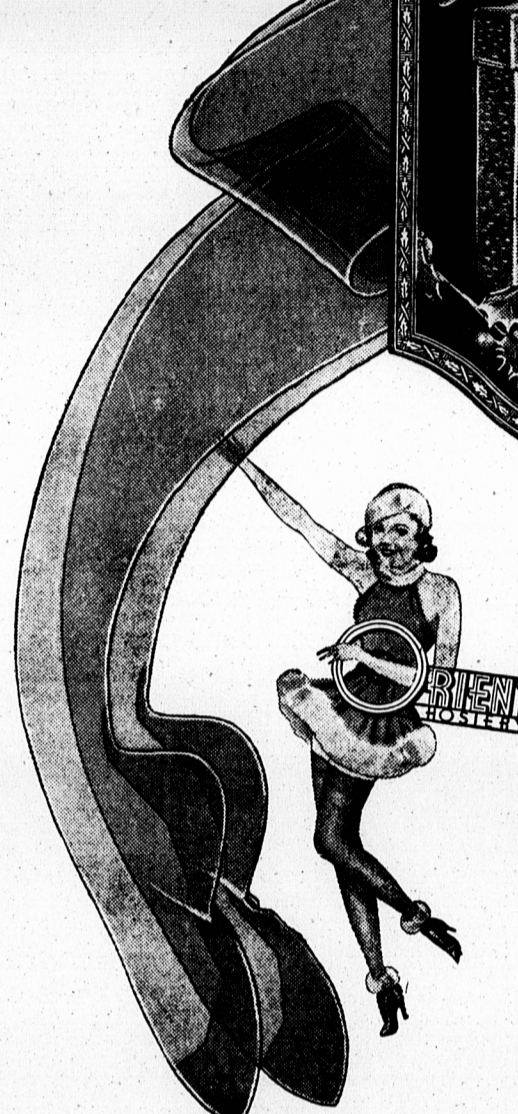
