A WIRELESS SYSTEM ACROSS THE STRAITS

Is Entirely Practicable—Distances of Over Two Hundred Miles Now Being Operated in Europe—Importance of Quick Telegraphic Communication.

It was mentioned in these columns that on the 11th instant, Hon. D. A. McKinnon, M. P., had cabled to Signor Marconi, now in Newfoundland, with a view to learn whether wireless telegraphy might not be adopted as a means of communication between the Island and the Mainland.

I., the Tribune's London correspondent cables as follows: There has just been issued an English translation of all the Dutch official telegrams issued during the war until the British troops occupied Vryheid. They provide extraordinary reading, comprising as they do the actual reports sent by the Boer commandoes, and the proclamations of leaders, showing the perfect system by which the Dutch were continually deceived and kept in ignorance of the true state of affairs.

FRUIT GROWERS' ASSOCIATION IN COBURG.

Mr. Richard Burke fruit inspector, who has been attending the meeting of the Ontario Fruit Growers' Association held in Coburg on the 4th, 5th and 6th returned on Wednesday. During the above dates eight meetings were held all of which were large. The people seemed to take great interest in fruit growing and made an effort to be present. The principal subjects discussed were New Fruits, The codling moth, Fruit Trade in England, Transportation and Cold Storage, The Fruit Marks Act, Spraying and Pruning Fruit Trees and General Cultivation of the same.

The tone of the meeting indicated that the people of Ontario do not consider fruit growing a secondary matter and are in it for business. While absent from the province Mr. Burke attended three conference meetings of the Fruit Inspectors where the fruit marks act and its operation were discussed. The idea of the meetings was to give each other information and assistance in the carrying out of the act. There was a creditable exhibit of winter apples, considering the fact that the crop was very light this year in Ontario. About 1,000,000 bushels is the estimated apple crop this year.

He was pleased to find in looking over the exhibit that fruit grown on Prince Edward Island compared very favorably both in regard to size, coloring

and quality. He returns to this province with his views greatly strengthened in the contention that this Island can easily hold its own with the neighboring provinces in the production of apples at least. Mr. Burke also believes that plums can be grown very successfully if attention is given to the orchard.
