MAN CONQUERS WITH SPIRITUAL WEAPONS

Sermon by Rev. Wm. Dobson, Pastor of First Methodist Church.

Christianity Teaches Man that His Weapons are Spiritual—Nations that Rise by Conquest Cannot Stand on Such a Foundation.

Text:—To him that overcometh, to him will I give to eat of the hidden manna. Rev. II. 17.

The text is the language of conquest. One can catch in its undertones the noise of the conflict and the shouts of victory. Nor need we be surprised at this, for again and again in the New Testament, the Christian's life is likened to a warfare—a warfare in which there is no discharge. "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith; and henceforth Timothy 'to war a good warfare, holding faith and a good conscience.' But it is not enough that the Christian is a warrior, he must conquer. The rewards are not to the warrior, but to the victor. To him that overcometh, to him will I give to eat of the hidden manna," "of the tree of life which groweth in the midst of the paradise of God." It must be further noted that through all the conflict, Christ must be the Christian's captain, who lays out the campaign, and selects the weapons. It is Christ's to command, the Christian's, to obey; Christ's, to choose the methods, the Christian's, to accept the choice. "Be ye, therefore, imitators of God, as dear children." If this be duty, let us know what it means, let us be sure of our ground. Some think that when Christ came into the world, He called off the conflict, He proclaimed a universal peace. He did so such thing. No man ever fought as did that Man of Nazareth. He stood against the mob, when it sought to stone Him; He fought the Pharisees, when they sought to smother His church, when she brought all her carnal weapons to bear upon Him; He fought an empire, while it used the weapons that empires use to-day; and in the warfare He was victorious, He won a kingdom and a crown. So far from proclaiming a universal peace, He not only fought Himself, but, so far as I know, He never uttered one word against war in its so-called nature. What He did do, and to most emphatically and authoritatively, was to change the weapons of war, and to assure us that "they who take the sword shall perish by the sword."

And it is one of the marvels to me, that one man cannot see the emphasis which history has put, and is putting upon this saying of our Lord's. It is the story of history, that nations have risen by conquest, lived by conquest, and perished by conquest. When will men learn the fact, that it is a truth, lying at the heart of things, that no nation can stand upon such a foundation?

In the lower stages of man's development, he seems to have been incapable of appreciating anything but brute force against bone, muscle against muscle, and the most deadly weapon, was looked upon as the greatest hero. It was by this method that not only kingdoms were built, but kings and aristocracy were made. What was true of the olden times, is true to-day where Christianity is held simply as a theology or a Creed, and not looked upon as the life and genius of Christ in the human soul. But real Christianity takes man up out of his animal nature, places him upon a higher platform, gives him a new surrounding, reveals to him his true relations to God and to humanity, and teaches him by this new evangel that the weapons of his warfare are not carnal, but spiritual. It is this revelation that is making men hesitate before they send into Kernity, unprepared, a soul for whom the Saviour died, or ten thousand of such souls, in order to gratify some ambition, or avenge some imaginary wrong. That the Christ-like spirit in the man should dominate the animal, is one of the hardest lessons we Christians have to learn. We think it so unmanly to check the animal passions and manifest the spirit of the Lord. Even the disciples of our Christ, when they saw their Master in danger in Samaria, came to Him, saying: "Wilt thou that we call down fire from heaven, and consume them?" But He, turning, rebuked them sharply, and said: "Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of."

The conflict to-day is as severe as it ever was.

give him a higher estimate of our nature and principles than he ever had before, and if it be a truth that love begets love, will it not enshrine us in his affections, and lead him to trust us even where he cannot understand us? It is this very principle of forgiveness that has led men to love the Christ, and lay down their lives for Him if needs be. It is one of the weapons of His warfare by which He is conquering the world, and driving back the powers of darkness. Let us then learn in this to be imitators of God as dear children, and, walking worthy of the vocation wherewith we are called, overcome not only the evil within ourselves, but the evil in our fellow-men.

Again: let us take Christ's doctrine of non-resistance of evil. He stated it Himself in the following words: "You have heard that it hath been said by them of old, an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, but I say unto you resist not evil." Whatever difficulties there may be in the interpretation of Christ's language, they vanish when laid beside His own life, for His life must ever be the interpretation of His teaching. And if these words are to be interpreted in the light of His life, then they are only a statement of the old doctrine that the weapons of the Christian's warfare are not carnal but spiritual. While He Himself ever resisted the evil with all the powers of His mind and spirit, He never brought physical force to bear upon evil in any of its manifestations. I know it has been said that He used physical force to drive men out of the Temple. I do not pretend to say what He might have done, but I do know that if He did use physical force on man in the Temple it is not written. I am sure the statement in John's Gospel will not bear that interpretation, and I think it may be safely said, that throughout His whole life, He never used physical force to defend Himself or to extend His Kingdom. So then I should look upon Christ's statement of the doctrine of non-resistance, not as mere Oriental rhetoric, but as an eternal principle lying in the depths of the nature of things, and one of the most effective weapons with which the evil of the world can be subdued. He certainly used it Himself, and He conquered. He taught His disciples to use it and with it they overcame.
