Election Trial.

The trial of the election petition of Mr. Murdoch McKinnon against Mr. A. F. Bruce has been going on in Georgetown since Monday 29th instant before the Master of the Rolls. The evidence so far heard discloses the use of liquor in connection with the election in several cases. Among the witnesses examined on Monday, Donald McDonald testified to receiving several parcels of liquor which he delivered according to instructions. George Connors, light house keeper got three bottles in a stable and delivered them to certain parties. Montague Annear drove some parties to the polls and treated them on the way. On Tuesday Charles McDonald testified that on informing Mr. Bruce that he would not vote for him the latter told him that he could bundle up and go. This was confirmed by Hugh McDonald, (Charles' son). They also testified that Mr. Bruce holds a mortgage on McDonald's farm. Montague Annear and Norman McDonald testified to treating. Dr. L. Barnes, who supported Mr. Bruce at the election, and is President of Liberal Association, denied some reports of alleged treating on his part. Donald McDonald testified to leaving six "parcels" at different houses of voters which was all the liquor he used. He got the parcels at Lauchlin Martin's.


