**MORE FOX COMPANIES.**—Two more fox companies are in course of formation in this island, and application is being made to the Governor-in-Council for their incorporation by Letters Patent. The names of the new concerns will be "The Dennis Black Fox Co., Ltd.," with a capital of \$35,000, divided into 350 shares of \$100 value each, and with its head office to be situated at O'Leary; and the "Recall Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd.," with a capital of \$10,000, divided into a hundred shares of the value of \$100 each, and chief place of business to be situated in Summerside. The provisional directors in the case of the Dennis Company are Messrs. H. Dennis, for rancher, of O'Leary; T. Clinton Dennis, Noel J. O'Glavin, J. W. Menzies and W. Milburn Dennis, Dominion land surveyors, of Ottawa. In the other company the applicants for incorporation are Alban and Wilfred Lacky, farmers of North Bedouque, Frank and Lyman Hall, farmers of Sherbrooke, and J. Harry England, farmer of Traveller's Rest.

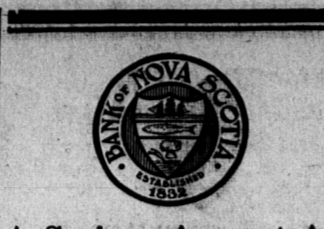
**FOR ST. JOHN.**—Nine of the carpenters employed here in the reconstruction of St. Dunstan's Cathedral with Messrs. John Metcalfe Company, leave this morning for St. John, N. B., where the above firm are erecting a large grain elevator. The men will work on the elevator putting in the conveyors.

**SPUR LINE WORK.**—Work is going on rapidly on the spur line to Carleton Point. About one hundred men are employed. One gang is working where the spur line joins the Cape Traverse line under Foreman McLeod of Alberton, another about half way with Thos. Gillespie as foreman, and Chas. McKenzie is in charge of another gang near the terminus. Mr. Chas. McDonald is time-keeper.

**SCHOOL INSPECTION.**—The School Inspectors of the province were in Charlottetown last Friday and Saturday, consulting with one another and with Superintendent Campbell concerning the finishing up of the work of the present school term and the planning of more vigorous and better work for next term. Premier Mathieson took advantage of the meeting to hold a lengthy conference with the Superintendent and inspectors concerning the condition of the schools and the best means of further improving them. As there are now five inspectors devoting their whole time to the work, Mr. Alfred Bouter, Tryon, Mr. Jas. viz., Mr. Marin Gallant, Urbansville, H. Devereaux, Kelly's Cross, Mr. Vernon Crockett, York, and Mr. D. J. Mullin, St. Peter's, it is expected that every school in the province will be visited at least twice a year and that the more backward schools will receive special attention.
