GERMANS ARE AGAIN REPULSED

PARIS, Dec. 2.—Semi-official advices received today by the Havas Agency contain an admission that the Austrians met further successes in Serbia after the rear guards actions during the past few days. The Serbian troops were compelled to fall back. Heavy fighting occurred near Souvaba where the Austrians were concentrated in large forces and succeeded in capturing two points, fighting at the Kolubara River is said to have been attended with some success for the Serbians. In an engagement near Lazarevatz, on November 28th, the Serbians are reported to have taken a position of importance capturing 27 officers and 2,000 men.

GERMAN FLEET READY TO FIGHT

COPENHAGEN, Dec. 3.—A correspondent here declares that the German fleet is ready to sail into the North Sea to do battle with the British and that an attack will be simultaneously conducted by submarines, warships and airships. A German Naval Brigade working at Zebrugge was interrupted by the activity of the British ships shelling that place.

PARIS, Dec. 3.—An official report issued yesterday afternoon said merely that the Germans again attempted to hack the way to the Seacoast and that heavy fighting is in prospect all along the line.

GERMAN OFFENSIVE HAVE HEAVY LOSSES

(Special to the Guardian.)
PETROGRAD, Dec. 2.—The Army Messenger, in a review of the fighting during the period from Nov. 28 to the 30th, says, "on the Russo-Prussian frontier the Germans have maintained their fortified positions and have been making attacks of little importance. These operations were without success and our army corps have kept their disposition. The German offensive in the Region of Lovicz was repulsed by our advance guards and cavalry, who inflicted heavy losses on the enemy. The same fate befell the German offensive at Dombrovo and Schutsoff. On the Thom-Cracow front the German guards which attempted an offensive suffered serious defeat in Trzbitz-Bogomioff District. Our troops took a large number of prisoners, assumed the offensive and repulsed several important points. Counting our attacks by the enemy were repulsed. The Austrian troops defending approaches to Cracow have been defeated and are falling back in disorder to the fortress. On the Galician we are advancing with ever increasing success."

ALLIES ARE NOW GAINING GROUND

(Special to the Guardian.)
PARIS, Dec. 2.—(Official tonight)—In Belgium a violent bombardment of Lampernisse to west of Dixmude has taken place. In the Argonne Region the enemy has blown up by a mine a salient point to the Northwest of Forest La Grurie. We are developing our progress on that part of the front. In Alsace our troops have taken the towns of Aspach Le Haut and Aspach Le Bas, Southeast of Thau. On the rest of the front there is nothing to report."

Of the Lord: These I'll avenge in My might.

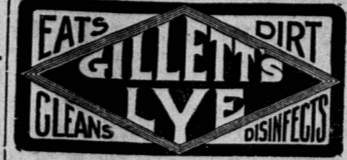
You are known to us now in your hateful shape;

GERMAN STEAMERS UNDER RESTRICTIONS

(Special to the Guardian.)
WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—Provisional President Guatierrez will enter Mexico City tomorrow and be installed in the National Palace there according to an official telegram to the States Department today.
Montevideo-Port authorities today prevented the German steamer Mera from taking on coal beyond the capacity of her bunkers. Restriction was placed upon the vessels coal supply because it is alleged by officials that Mera's crew attempted to smuggle coal through her bunkers into the ship's hold. The Mera is one of three German vessels coaling and provisioning at this port and the presence of the steamer is generally believed to be connected with the reported arrival of the German Pacific squadron in the Southern Atlantic.

LIDDITE EXPLOSION CAUSES ALARM

(Special to the Guardian.)
BRADFORD, Dec. 2.—A large stock of Liddite exploded with a roar today in the channel works near this city. Six men were killed and many injured. Hundreds of windows in Bradford and nearby villages were broken. People were in great alarm some believing the noise was the roar of guns of an invading German Army.

BELGRADE HAS BEEN OCCUPIED

VIENNA, Dec. 2.—Austrian troops today occupied Belgrade Serbia.
