ASIATIC INVASION GREAT PROBLEM

Fielding in London Hopeful That Yellow Peril May be Averted—Relies on Friendship of Britain With Japan to Bring Calm.

MONTREAL, Sept. 26.—The Star's special cable from London says: Hon. Messrs. Fielding and Brod-ur-st; fulfilling many engagements here before sailing on Friday. Journalists find them mute on the subject of the Franco-Canadian treaty. Mr. Fielding admits he agreed with the French ministers to make no disclosures until the dominion parliament meets in November. The effect of this secrecy is, of course, to whet the appetite of both journalists and politicians who are inclined to suggest that the real reason for secrecy is that the intermediate tariff, at this, its first use, has proved insufficient to secure the concessions desired from France, hence it is presumed there is necessity for a fresh act of the dominion parliament, giving France better terms than the intermediate rates and lessening the British preference margin on certain goods, probably such as silks, flannels, printed cottons, soaps, wines and china.

Mr. Fielding when directly asked, merely replied that the treaty is based practically on the intermediate tariff. It is anticipated here that the French treaty will form the first sequel including arrangements with Germany, Austria and Italy and it is contended that if the intermediate tariffs is abandoned in these cases also the British preferences must necessarily tend to vanish.

COMMEMORATION ANNIVERSARY

The Sixty Fifth of the Order of the Sons of Temperance.

All Sons of Temperance of this Province who are readers of The Guardian are reminded that the sixty-fifth anniversary of the Order was commemorated yesterday September 27th, which day fifty-six years ago the Order sprang into existence, and which has since become such an important factor in the great struggle against the common enemy of the race.

It might be of some interest to give here the following brief statistics re its organization. The United States the popular and wealthy neighbor to the south claims the birth-place of the Order which is so widely known throughout British North America today.

The spread of the Washingtonian movement in the United States was followed by a reaction, when thousands returned to their old drinking habits.

It was at this epoch that the Sons of Temperance hoisted their flag to combat the storm. On the 23rd day of September 1842 six men stood over its cradle, viz Daniel H. Sands, Jas. W. Oliver, Wm. B. Tompkins, Jas. Hale, Edw. Brush, Isaac J. Oliver, Thos. Eagerly, Geo. McGibbon, Jas. H. Bare, Thos. Swenerton, W. W. Wolfe, J. R. Elliott, Jas. McWeller, Jno. Holman, Harry Lloyd and Ephraim Snow. These men after adopting a suitable constitution and by-laws organized on Oct. 7th 1842, New York Division, No. 1, Sons of Temperance with Daniel H. Sands as their first Worthy Patriarch, afterwards becoming the first Grand Worthy Patriarch and Most Worthy Patriarch of the Order for North America.

It had for its object: 1st to shield its members from the evils of intemperance; 2nd, To afford mutual assistance in cases of sickness; 3rd, To elevate their character as men. The principles thus enunciated entitled the organization to the best class of society.

On the 8th day of May 1848 R. G. Halls a temperance lecturer arrived in Ch. Town.

He lectured in the Baptist Chapel on Tuesday evening, in the Methodist Chapel on Wednesday evening, and organized on Thursday May 13th at 2 p. m. at the old Court House Prince Edward Division No. 1, Charlottetown, which division is still living, holding regular meetings every Thursday evening in Wright's Hall. It has a present membership of about 150 faithful and devoted Sons and Daughters of Temperance and giving good prospects of becoming a living monument to the noble and beloved Order.

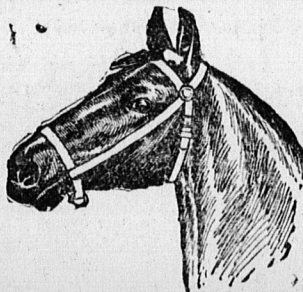

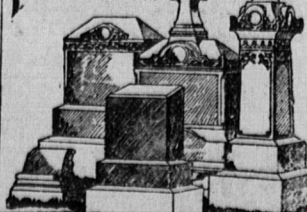
