GREAT DISCOVERIES IN MEDICINE.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 7.—Remarkable and almost instantaneous cures are said to have been made in severe cases of Tuberculosis pneumonia and typhoid fever at the Southern Pacific Hospital during the last month by a new method of treatment discovered by Dr. Schafer of Bakersfield.

The principle is that bacteria throw off certain substances while growing. These poisons are excluded to preserve the organisms of life. It was Dr. Schafer's ideal that if these educations could be formed in serum capable of injection into the human system affected by a disease caused by like bacteria, it would have the effect of immediately arresting the bacteria's growth.

Nine Southern Pacific Hospital patients suffering from pneumonia were inoculated with a liquid extract made from metabolic products given off by pneumonia germs in progress of growth.

In every case the patient was cured, several of the cures being within 24 hours of the serum's injection.

A tuberculosis patient was pronounced cured in four days. Similar suc-

cess with typhoid fever is reported. Conservative practitioners who have followed the experiments are astounded.

P. W. COLLEGE CRITICISED.

Sir,—Is the Prince of Wales College as an institution of learning fulfilling the conditions of requirement that the people of this Province as an agricultural community stand in need of? To answer this question in the affirmative might be in keeping with the views of a few persons who look upon education solely as a means of enabling a student sometime in the future to fill one or other of the so-called learned professions, but with respect to the people in general throughout this Island a very different view of the matter is taken. In their opinion the education of our young people should be more in a line with that qualification required to fit them for good and useful citizenship, instead of first, last and all the time imposing upon them a course of instruction calculated to prepare them for high standing in some of the learned professions.

We all know how common an occurrence it is for an institution, especially one of learning, to gradually drift out of touch with the conditions of its environment, to become fossilized through the dominating influence of one or more back numbers on the staff of instructors. The great majority of those who attend P. W. College are either teachers of the third or second class, who wish to obtain a higher grade license, or matriculants who wish to become teachers. The course of instruction should therefore be in accordance with the requirements for the qualification of school-teachers who aim to become instructors of youth in the rural districts and in the small towns. The few who wish hereafter to resume their studies abroad in some one of the larger institutions of learning could receive separate or additional instruction in the required branches of study.

By a reference to the calendar of the P. W. College and Normal School I find under the heading of the "Curriculum" that the subjects of study for the first year comprise nineteen in number, those for the second year sixteen in number and those for the third year eleven in number, making in all a total of 46 subjects. When the period of examination arrives the poor student's brain cells must be sorely surcharged with this long list of subjects crammed and jammed into his unfortunate cranium. This I submit is not education but intellectual dislocation.

Under the heading of College Government we read as has been noted as follows: "In the granting of diplomas and certificates, marks are assigned to the different subjects of the curriculum according to the following schedule: Greek, 300; Arithmetic, 200." I adduce these two subjects in illustration. From this we see that in the qualification for school teacher the Greek is as necessary as the arithmetic. How many farmers' sons and daughters do we find studying Greek in our public schools? My answer is that more are to be found, if we accept the very few in the higher schools who wish to take a course in some university.

At many an annual school meeting I have heard the reason assigned against voting a supplement for a school teacher to the following effect: The teachers are not qualified at P. W. College for the purpose of instructing the sons and daughters of farmers and mechanics in the branches that require to be taught with the ulterior aim of enabling them to take an advanced place in some university in order that great merit may be ascribed to this institution which prepares such men and sends them abroad to reflect honor upon their instructors and glory upon their country.

In view of the fact that the farmers and laborers in the final analysis pay about all the taxes in this Province, I claim that they have a right to know what becomes of their money, so that if the P. W. College is not fulfilling the conditions of requirement to which the people have an undoubted right, that I would suggest that some alteration in the curriculum be made so that those who do not wish to teach school but to take up further studies in one of the universities may be allowed to form a separate class in the college to which might be taught those branches the teacher does not require, such as Greek and the higher branches of mathematics.

During the past decade the teacher's qualification has become very much higher than it was. The percentage of marks required in each branch for a pass is at present unreasonably high, when we take into consideration the paltry, begrudgingly sweated in the form of a salary doled out to him for services fully rendered—notwithstanding the incontrovertible fact that no person in the community fulfils any function in the interests of the rising generation that in any way equals that of the school teacher.

I trust that our Government will take this matter into earnest consideration at the next session of the Legislature and endeavor to make such improvements in our school laws as will meet out at least some

degree of justice to our underpaid and overqualified, or wrongly qualified school teachers.

As a farmer who obtains his support from the soil by the sweat of his brow, I have much more to say on this subject and shall return to it on a future occasion. Meanwhile I have tried to enunciate some of the sentiments entertained in general by the farmers of P. E. Island.
