LONDON, Nov. 3.—Queen Victoria has approved the appointment of Lord Salisbury as premier and Lord Privy Seal, and Marquis of Lansdowne as Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Mr. William St. John Broderick as Secretary of State for War, the Earl of Selborne as First Lord of the Admiralty, and Mr. C. T. Ritchie as Secretary of State for home affairs.
