THE SWANSEA TRADER.—The S. S. Swansea Trader sailed from Halifax Tuesday morning at 7 o'clock for Charlottetown.

RAILWAY APPOINTMENT.—Mr. J. F. McInnis, relieving agent of the P. E. I. R., has been appointed Station agent at Bear River, replacing Mr. John Power, who is now agent at St. Peter's.

LAD INJURED.—The young son of Mr. John Gornerly, Charlottetown, who was badly cut about the legs and had his arm broken by falling off a loaded dray Monday afternoon, is resting as well as can be expected.

POLICE COURT.—At the Charlottetown Police Court yesterday morning, one drunk, John Sherry was committed to jail for 30 days. The case of Robert Stanley for an infraction of the prohibition act was adjourned. A case of assault and battery of Henry Wee's vs Barney Caragher resulted in a fine of \$7 and costs being imposed on the defendant.

THE CASPEDIA.—The S. S. Caspedia, from Montreal, with a large general cargo and full list of passengers arrived in Charlottetown Monday evening at 5 o'clock. She sailed again at an early hour yesterday morning for Pictou. She returns here at 4 o'clock on Thursday from Pictou and sails the same night for Montreal.

LAST TRIP.—The S. S. Trinidad of the Quebec S. S. Line, is due to arrive here Monday, August 25th, from Quebec. After four hours in Charlottetown she leaves on return to New York, calling at Halifax. This will be the last trip the Trinidad will make on this route this season. Judging from the large passenger lists she has enjoyed each trip it appears that the excursion trips are proving very popular.

BINDER TWINE.—A Horne & Co. have a large quantity of binder twine in green sheaf, Standard, Manila and pure Manila which they are offering at exceptional prices. Farmers are reminded however that the grain crop is exceptionally heavy this year and will cause a brisk demand. The careful farmer will buy his binder twine at once to guard against delay.

HORSES FOR THE RACES.—The following horses left yesterday for New Amman, to take part in the Races there today. Zealot, owned by D. McKenna, Vernon; Cleight, D. Robertson North River; Acquiri, owned by Dr. J. M. Nicholson Charlottetown; Dry Cleaner, owned by E. F. Acorn, Charlottetown; Shrub and Orwell Bell and Catherine N. Several horses will also be there from Summerside Tignish and vicinity. The race promises to be one of the best ever held in Prince County. There will be no special from Charlottetown but passengers can go by the regular trains at 7.45 and 11.45 a.m., returning by the express, at reduced fares.

ELECTED OFFICERS.—The grand officers were elected at the triennial convention of L'Assomption Society at Shediac last week for the next three years. Rev. Dr. Gauthier, P. E. I., was elected Spiritual Advisor. The removal of the headquarters of the Society to Moncton means that Mr. J. H. LeBlanc, the financial secretary, and treasurer Cormier, will make their home in future, removing from Walkham, Mass. One of the important matters dealt with at the recent convention was the insurance feature. Formerly there was practically no insurance connected with the society, the amount being only \$100. At the Shediac convention the insurance was increased to \$1000.

ACCIDENTS.—Mr. Maurice Doiron, head teamster for Auld Bros., met with a painful and regrettable accident on Sunday night. He was returning with his wife from a visit to Rustico and while their horse was turning in onto St. Peter's Road in the darkness they drove over a pile of clay, which upset their carriage with the result that the occupants were thrown out, Mr. Doiron having one of his legs broken in three places and being badly bruised. Mrs. Doiron also receiving a severe shaking up. As the result of the accident Mr. Doiron will probably be off duty for the rest of the season. The accident is deeply to be regretted.
