FASCISTS PAY HOMAGE TO LATE PONTIFF

CRITICAL TIME IN RELATIONS WITH STATE

Death Prevented Expected New Depreciation Of Fascism's Attitude To Church.

ROME, Feb. 10—(AP)—The fascist Grand Council today paid homage to Pope Pius XI, whose death today occurred at a critical moment in relations between the Holy See and the fascist government.

Anniversary Of Accord

Tomorrow will be the 10th anniversary of the Lateran Accord of Feb. 11, 1929, which ended a bitter, 59-year quarrel between the church and state and the voluntary abandonment of the papal states.

The official gazette today reminded all Italian officials that Italy was bound under the Lateran Accord in no wise to interfere with the election of a new pope.

All Christendom Pays Tribute To "Pope Of Peace"

Body Lies In State In Sistine Chapel While World Leaders Join In Expressions Of Grief.

(By The Canadian Press)
The death of Pope Pius XI, an apostle of peace in a world tormented with strife, caused common grief today among Roman Catholics, 330,000,000 of the earth's people of whom he was spiritual father and non-Catholics alike.

In Canada, members of the House of Commons paid tribute to the memory of the Pontiff. Justice Minister Ernest Lapointe read a message sent by Prime Minister Mackenzie King to the Vatican in which was expressed the Government's sense of loss in the Pope's death.

Offers Condolences

In the United States, millions of sorrowing Catholics prayed for the soul of the Holy Father, while President Roosevelt, in a message dispatched through State Secretary Hull, offered his "profound condolences" and spoke of Pope Pius' "zeal for peace and tolerance."

Cathedral Thronged

Worshippers thronged to the great Cathedral of the Westminister Archdiocese in London and preparations were made in England's only member of the College of Cardinals, Arthur Cardinal Hinsley, who called Pope Pius "one of the great men of the world."

Solemn Services In Toronto Will Mark Death Of Pope Pius

COLD SPELL GRIPS WEST, THREE DEAD

Biting Winds And Snowdrifts Spread From Coast To Pacific Coast.

Deaths From Exposure

Two persons died from the cold in British Columbia. John McPhail, 71-year-old prospector, was found frozen to death only five yards from his cabin at Lonely Lake in the Bruce River District and Joe Hamran, 58, died from exposure after collapsing in his cabin at Prince George.
