Little Change In New York Stocks

NEW YORK, Feb. 3.—(AP)—Selected recoveries continued in today's first February stock market but many leaders faltered at the last and, for the seventh straight Monday, the overall average failed to score a plus sign.

Transfers of 770,000 shares compared with 890,000 Friday and 650,000 a week ago. The Associated Press 50-stock composite was unchanged at 63.2.

Canadian issues were lower with the exception of Hiram Walker, up 1-8. Dome Mines dropped 1-4. Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagrams both eased 1-8. McIntyre was unquoted.

On the curb, Lake Shore lost 1-4. Allied Chemical was up 1-2 at 180 and Union Pacific 1 at 182. Equitable Office Building was active at a new 1947-48 high of 5, up 3-8. Ahead were General Motors, Goodrich, Oliver Corp., Deere, Boeing, Schenley, Western Union, Anaconda, Phelps Dodge, Du Pont, Rock Island Railroad, Atlantic Coast Line, Standard Oil (NJ) and Transcontinental and Western Air.

Monsanto Chemical dipped 3 1-2 at 53 1-2, following announcement of new stock financing and despite an earnings jump. Off a point or so were U. S. Gypsum at 55 1-2, Plymouth Oil 46, Douglas Aircraft 53 and International Harvester 87 1-4.

Fractional casualties included Bethlehem Steel, U. S. Steel, Firestone Tire, Chrysler, Sears Roebuck, United Aircraft, Columbia Gas, Electric Power and Light, Santa Fe, N. Y. Central, Southern Railway, Northern Pacific.

Narrow Price Changes On Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Feb. 2.—(CP)—Gains and losses were evenly distributed in industrials on the stock exchange and curb market today. Price adjustments were mainly narrow and turnover improved. Mines were slightly easier in active trading.

Closing averages indicated banks off .15 at 27.62; utilities off .3 at 73.6; industrials unchanged at 118.9; papers up .85 at 332.5; golds off .10 at 71.73. Approximate industrial sales were 37,500 shares and mining sales totalled 188,500 shares, an increase of \$2,600 over Friday's total.

Papers were mixed. Abtibi Pfd. advanced 3-8 at 20 and Consolidated Paper was up 1-8 at 17 1-2. On the downside were International Paper off 1-4 at 54 1-2 and Abtibi, shaded at 15 1-2.

Oils displayed a firm tone. Imperial Oil added 1-8 at 15 1-4 on a turnover of 1,295 shares and International Petroleum was up a similar fraction at 13 7-8. Calgary and Edmonton and Home Oil were ahead 25 cents each. Their respective closing quotations were 4.40 and 6.50. Okalta went forward seven cents at 1.30 but McColl Rights dropped two cents at 18 on a turnover of 19,432 shares.

In utilities, Bell recovered 1 3-4 points of last week's three-point loss at 163 3-4. Winnipeg Electric eased 1 1-2 points at 23 1-2 and Ottawa Electric Railway declined one point at 30 on a turnover of 1,115 shares. Shawinigan was shaded at 21 5-8 and Brazilian slipped 1-4 at 18 3-8.

International Nickel rose 1-2 at 33 1-4 and Hudson Bay Mining 1-4 at 47 1-2 in metals. Consolidated Smelting touched a new high of 100 3-4 then dropped back to 100 1-8 to register a net loss of 1-4.

Civic Election

Voters lists have been prepared for the Civic Election to be held on Wednesday, February 11th, 1948, and will be posted for the inspection of all electors at the City Court Room, City Building, up to and including February 5th, 1948, from 11 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. daily.

Voters are advised to ascertain that their names are properly listed in all Wards in which they are qualified to vote.

VOTING QUALIFICATIONS (General)

All males and females must be:—

- 21 years of age and upwards.
- Resident of City for One Year (except (4) below).
- British Subjects.
- Not in arrears on December 31st, 1947, for Civic Rates, Taxes or Assessments.

And must be also qualified under one of the following:—

- Owner of freehold of lands or premises for 3 months previous to the Election to the value of One Hundred Dollars.
- (Males) Tenant or occupant for 3 months at annual rental value of Fourteen Dollars.
- (Males) Have paid Poll Tax of Five Dollars for 1947 on or before December 31st, 1947.
- Male or female, non-resident but otherwise qualified as above, if doing business and occupying business premises in the City. If qualification is freehold, to vote only in Ward or Wards where freehold lies, otherwise only in Ward of business occupancy.

MULTIPLE VOTING—

Persons voting on sections (1) and (2) as above may vote in each Ward in which they are so qualified.

Persons voting on section (3) may vote only in the Ward of which they are resident.

Property or rental qualification sufficient in time but having removed from one Ward to another within 3 months next preceding date of Election entitles vote in former Ward only.
