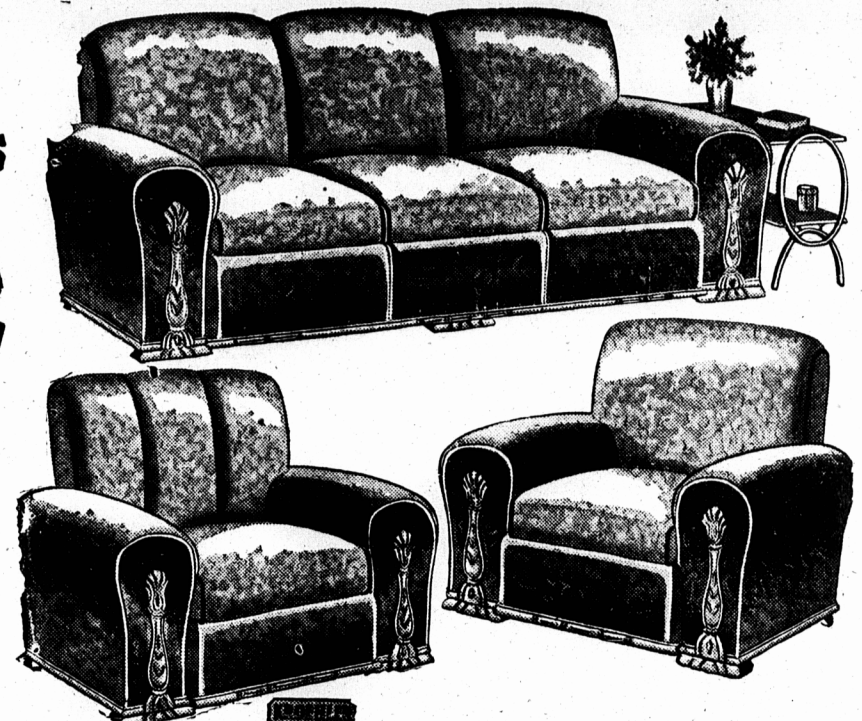

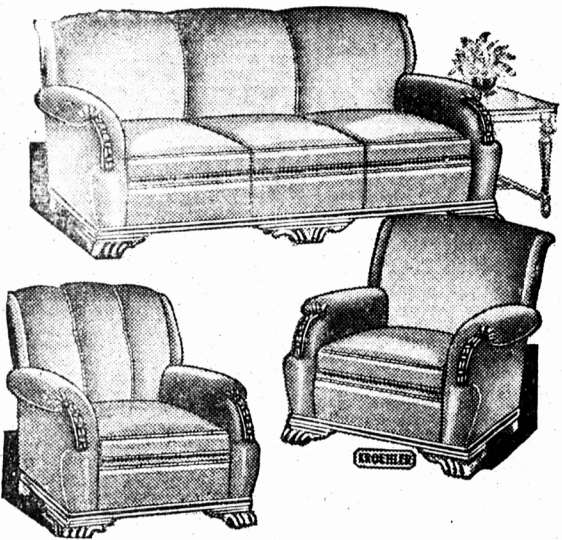

Sopwith didn't take his trial boat out on today's round. Endeavour, 1934 challenger, was fast at her mooring all day. As on other days, the sleek new racer sailed casually around the course, with little to mark her excursion from an ordinary pleasure cruise.

Praises Unions Of Old England

NEW YORK, July 19—(CP)—Returning from a survey of labor conditions in Europe, Colonel Frank Knox, Chicago Newspaper publisher, pointed to British trade unions as an example to United States labor. His tour took him through 10 countries, including Germany, France and Great Britain.

The publisher, who ran for the Vice-Presidency on the Republican ticket in last year's presidential election, praised the "sense of responsibility of British labor leaders and their followers."

1936 Fisheries Value Highest In 6 Years

RETURN IN EVERY PROVINCE GREATER THAN IN 1935 WITH VALUE OF DOMINION OUTPUT NEARLY \$39,158,000

Fisheries production in Canada last year came almost to \$39,158,000 in value and not only exceeded the 1935 figure by over \$4,700,000 but reached the highest dollar level since 1930.

As compared with the total for 1932, the year when the world's economic tailspins were probably at their worst, the 1936 return from the fisheries showed an improvement of more than \$13,200,000.

In every province last year the marketed value of fisheries output was larger than in 1935. Only in the case of the Yukon Territory was there a decrease, \$7,340, and Yukon production is never large. The biggest gain, \$2,062,000 in round figures, was in British Columbia, which continued to lead all the provinces in total value.

In Nova Scotia there was the tidy gain of more than a million-

in the United States," he said. "Labor unions in England are responsible organizations," Knox declared. "They register themselves, make a public yearly accounting of their funds and keep open books. Employers can deal with them in the sure knowledge that their pledges are sound and their contracts will be faithfully kept."

"We should have something like the British 'Court of Inquiry' which investigates strikes and publishes the facts as a guide to public opinion. It is hopeless for either side to fight on if the public decides that the opposite cause is just, and that has taught both sides that violence is the worst enemy to the cause."

Knox said France was carrying out interesting labor reforms but the political situation there was so muddled that conclusions could not be drawn at present.

Under the Fascist system, he said, labor unions simply "wink out." "There can't be such a thing as a real union in the organization of a Fascist state."

\$1,052,000. New Brunswick, with a betterment of \$449,800, and not so very far behind was Manitoba, which had a gain of little more than \$409,000 to its credit. Ontario's figures increased by over \$357,400. Quebec's gain was approximately \$161,150; in Saskatchewan there was an increase of very close to \$115,000, in Alberta an increase of about \$84,150, and in Prince Edward Island \$46,650.

Returns by Provinces

Total marketed value, by provinces, omitting odd figures, was as follows, according to records prepared by the Dominion Department of Fisheries and the several provincial departments concerned with fisheries matters: British Columbia, \$17,231,530; Nova Scotia, \$8,905,140; New Brunswick, \$4,399,420; Ontario, \$3,209,420; Quebec, \$2,108,400; Manitoba, \$1,667,370; Prince Edward Island, \$946,330; Saskatchewan, \$367,020; Alberta, \$309,880.

The production in the Yukon was valued on the market at \$13,385.

NEW TILED BATHROOM

A glass top may be made or it may be done in the fashion of a boudoir table. A standing mirror placed directly in the window is a distinct aid to make-up.
