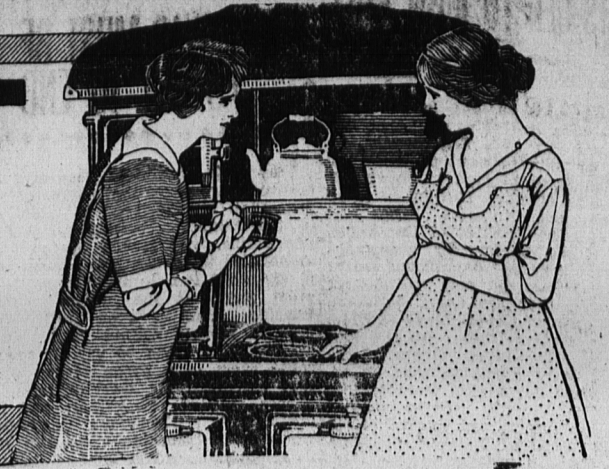

### An "Italian Sky"

Many people have written rhapsodies in praise of the "deep blue sky" of Italy. The blue is deeper, not because the dust there is finer than in the northern countries, but because in the countries of the north, due to the greater coarseness of the air, the vapor more readily condenses upon the dust particles. The dust particles thus, become large, and consequently not so effective in turning back the blue rays alone, but others are also reflected, and a grayish light is produced. In a single location the blue of the sky may appear bluer at one time than another. The sky is oftentimes said to be very blue when some white cumulous clouds are outlined against it, in consequence of the great contrast with the brilliant white. After a shower, when the lower stratum of air is washed of its coarse dust particles, a deeper and purer blue is the result. —Family Herald.

### ILLUMINATING GAS IS FUEL FOR LONDON BUSES

Old Mother Necessity has produced another invention and this time one of such unusual appearance that not only is it described and illustrated in the October Number of Popular Mechanics Magazine, but also pictured in color on the cover. The shortage of gasoline and methyl alcohol in Europe and the vital necessity of conserving the available supply for military purposes have brought about the use of illuminating gas as a fuel for motor busses operating between

London and some of its suburbs. Buses that resemble small captive balloons are anchored to the tops of the big cars and inflated by pumps at filling stations that have been established along the routes of travel. Certain of these are understood to be merely lamp posts conveniently situated at the curbs. The plan obviously has necessitated certain mechanical changes in the engines which, at least, involve the carburetors, besides the feeding and compression systems. The amount of power obtained from the lighting gas depends upon a number of things, and a reliable estimate could not be made without more detailed information than is at hand. It is not altogether clear why unwieldy bags are being used instead of compact steel cylinders which could carry gas under high pressure. Although, at first thought, it seems that there might be danger of accidental ignition, this is undoubtedly avoided by providing fireproof covers for the bags.

### OLEO INTRODUCTION WON'T HURT DAIRYING

It is stated that at the Milwaukee stockyards, where the run of calves for the months of March and April totalled 48,910 head, the receipts run from 85 to 90 per cent. male calves. It is further stated that there are several buyers on that market who purchase well-marked, well-formed and thoroughly-sound heifer calves and ship them back to the country to be raised to make dairy cows. Farmers in the United States—according to

reports from many stock yard commission men, cow-testing associations and others—are not shipping milk cows to the slaughter houses or stock yards at an alarming rate, as has been claimed; and they are holding back a greater number of heifer calves than ever before. In reply to the question: Are there any good heifer calves from pure-bred bulls being sold for veal? 39 out of 47 cow-testing associations in Wisconsin replied "No," four "Yes," and four "Few." This evidence of trust in the future of the dairy business, coming from a country where oleomargarine has been manufactured and in use for years, goes to show that very little account is taken, by the dairymen, of the possibility of this material interfering with the dairy industry. Oleomargarine will doubtless displace inferior butter, but what farmer ever made a good living out of poor butter? The small supply of good butter that is produced now can easily hold its own in competition with any butter substitute, while there are several other better channels for the disposal of the milk that has always been, to a great extent, wasted in the making of inferior grades of butter. Canadian dairy farmers may well decide to raise all their heifer calves that are at all promising, with assurance that there will be a good market for the milk that they will give later. And there will be money in it for the seller or buyer of these prospective milk cows if not one of them ever arrives at the stock market, merely to be reshipped to the country. Transportation costs too much money for that kind of business.
