ASSOCIATION OF THE DISCIPLES OF CHRIST. The Disciples of Christ met in annual as a colation with the church in New Glasgow. The first meeting was held on Friday evening July 10th. Bro. Wm. Murray of East point preached a simple and eloquent sermon. His subject was "Christian Service." The speaker most earnestly impressed on his hearers the prime necessity of consecrating the heart and soul to the Master's cause. This message as given by Bro. Murray on this occasion will not be readily forgotten. Saturday evening Pastor A. N. Simpson on behalf of the New Glasgow congregation delivered an address of hearty welcome to the visiting strangers which was responded to by Bros. Murray; Dewar, (New Zealand); Motley, Gebbie, Ford; (Nova Scotia); Dewar, (New Perth); and Reilly (Summerside.) These all spoke in very felicitous terms and with most flattering to the people of New Glasgow whose hospitality was duly praised.

SUNDAY'S MEETINGS SUNDAY MORNING BEGINNING AT 10.30 A half hour social meeting was held, led by Bro R. W. Stevenson after which the associational sermon was delivered by Bro. W. R. Motley of Montague. This sermon was a fine effort on the part of Bro. Motley, and marked by depth of thought, and scholarly finish. The subject was "Behold the Man." In the evening after prayer and praise service Bro. Gibbie of Lord's Cove, N. B. preached on "The Triumphant Valedictory of Paul." This eloquent sermon was listened to with closest attention. The speaker referred to the different passages in the life of the great apostle, the trials and the difficulties and the final glorious consummation of that marvelous life so well summed up in the words "I have fought the good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith, henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness that fadeth not away, eternal in the heavens." It should be the Christian's ambition to imitate the life of Paul, who so abundantly caught the spirit of the Master.

The church was filled to its utmost capacity in all its Sunday meetings and many were unable to gain entrance.

A quartette "Saved by Grace" was well sung by Sisters Ella Simpson and Gertrude Toombs and Bros. Eldon McKay and John Clarke. A solo by Sister Gertrude Toombs and a duet by Sister Gertrude Toombs and Bro. Leonard McKay were both beautifully sung. The duet was repeated by request in the evening meeting. Sister Ethel Connors of Summerside read a paper on "The Sunday School" which was highly appreciated as was also an admirable paper on "Womans work in the Church" read by Sister Cannon also of Summerside.
