The season is now re-opening and it is expected that this year the Club will meet with even greater success than was theirs last year. Tonight the boys will meet at Von Olm's at seven o'clock for the opening shoot. This year Russell Gay will charge of the birds and will supply those shooting as desired. This will undoubtedly prove a much more satisfactory season than that prevailing last season.

The Department of Education is issuing a timely suggestion in reference to the necessity of explaining to the young the significance of the coming coronation ceremony. It is as follows: As Thursday, 22nd inst., has been proclaimed a public holiday by the Government of the Dominion, and consequently a holiday for all the Public Schools of this Province, it is only right and becoming that the teachers should give their pupils some idea of its significance. The Superintendent of Education, accordingly, thinks that the lessons on the meaning of the ceremony and the various emblematic acts throughout its course should be given in anticipation of the event. If no other source of information be available, attention should be drawn to such articles as will frequently appear on this subject in the daily newspapers during the ensuing fortnight. The occasion is so rich in historical interest that it ought not to be allowed to pass without evoking something more than the satisfaction which is experienced from the enjoyment of a special holiday.
