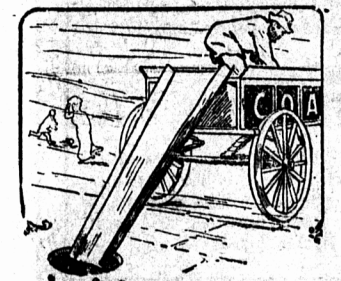

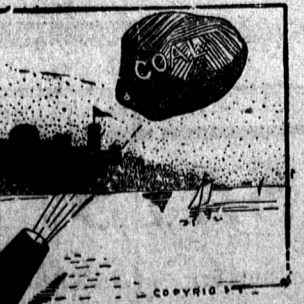

The Rev. Professor DesBarres was recently much gratified at securing in an auction sale from the Libbie Company of Boston three large folio maps dating back to 1779-81 and the work of his illustrious great-great-grandfather, Colonel J. F. W. DesBarres, who in addition to being the founder of Sydney, C. B., the Governor of Cape Breton for twenty-one years, and of P. E. I. for eight years, was for sixteen years employed by the British government in making surveys and charts of the coast of North America. The results of this survey were given to the public in four large volumes pronounced by the Dictionary of National Biography to be "the most splendid collection of charts, plans, and views ever published." Professor Sweetser, who for several years was a member of the Science Faculty at Mt. Allison, and since leaving Sackville has held a chair in the Case College of Applied Science in Cleveland, Ohio, has made a couple of inventions having for their object the better working of gasoline engines, particularly those employed in flying machines.
