**THE EXPRESS.**—The mail express from the West arrived last night at 11.15 o'clock.  
**THE PICTOU BOAT.**—The S. S. Northumberland docked at Charlottetown last evening at 8.10.  
**NURSES GRADUATION.**—The P. E. Island Hospital Nurses Graduation takes place in Zion Church Hall this evening at 8 o'clock. Silver collection at the door. 2334.  
**STREET CLEANER.**—The city's new street cleaning machine was tried yesterday on the streets of Charlottetown and proved very satisfactory.  
**TWELVE O'CLOCK DANCE.**—Miss Bertha Gorman held a successful twelve o'clock dance in Smallwood's Hall last night at which there was a good attendance.  
**KENSINGTON.**—The Rev. V. W. Purdy, M. A., will address a meeting in the Presbyterian Church, Kensington this (Tuesday) evening at 8 o'clock on the movement in behalf of delinquent girls.  
**FUNERAL TOMORROW.**—The funeral of the late Judge McDonald will take place on Wednesday, at 1.45 p. m. from St. James Church, where the body is now lying, to the Railway Station, thence, by special train, to Belfast, where the interment will take place.  
**PLANT LINE.**—The Plant Line steamer, Halifax, sails from Boston on Saturday next for Charlottetown and is due to arrive here on Monday, May 18th. She leaves on return on the following day, and will be sailing from Charlottetown on every Tuesday, at noon, thereafter.  
**CITY COUNCIL.**—The monthly meeting of the City Council was held last night under the presidency of Mayor R. H. Sterns. A variety of matters of no unusual importance were dealt with. Owing to pressure of space a detailed report is unavoidably held over for the next issue of the Guardian.  
**THE PRINCE EDWARD.**—The Prince Edward Theatre had good houses last night when a good picture program was presented. The leading picture was "King The Detective," a unique detective story in two parts. It was an excellent photo-play, the leading part being taken by "King Baggot of the Movies." The two other dramas were "Atonement," being good productions heartily enjoyed. "One of the First," was a comedy that kept the audience in a constant uproar. Mr. Cairns sang, by request, "Till the Sands of the Desert Grow Cold," and was loudly applauded.  
**THE PEOPLE'S.**—The People's continues to maintain its reputation for moving picture entertainments of the highest class. Last night's was fully up to the theatre's fine standard and was much enjoyed by crowded houses. A stirring detective story entitled "The Broad Stairway," a western drama, "Broncho Billy's Oath," Little's nightmare, "Peanty in the Sea Shell," and "Curfew shall not ring Tonight," comprised a splendid programme. **DELINQUENT GIRLS' HOME.**—A largely attended meeting was held last evening in the Kindergarten Hall when the Rev. Mr. Purdie, in an eloquent and forcible speech, outlined the purposes of the Home which it is proposed to establish for delinquent Protestant girls of the Maritime Provinces. Mr. Purdie abundantly proved the necessity for such an institution and made an able appeal to his audience to contribute generously to a highly deserving cause. He thanked the people for their attendance. Dr. T. F. Fullerton followed with a brief address, delivered in his characteristically strong style. The Hon. W. S. Stewart also spoke, heartily endorsing the remarks of the previous speakers. The speakers were introduced by The Premier, the Hon. J. A. Matheson. At the conclusion of the meeting a number of gentlemen signed their names to subscription cards which Mr. Purdie laid on the table. The architectural plans of the institution were also put on the table for inspection. In another issue an extended report of the speeches will be given. The subscription last evening amounted to \$480.
