**In Memoriam**

**GEORGE LESLIE HASLAM**

There entered peacefully into eternal rest at the Prince Edward Island Hospital on June 4, 1947, George L. Haslam of "Hazeldean", Springfield, P. E. I.

The late Mr. Haslam had not been in his usual good health for some few months, and three days before his death entered the hospital. Here despite best medical attention and loving care, he passed away in the early morning hours of the above date. His death was a gloom mingled with deep sorrow over the community.

Mr. Haslam was the eldest son of the late Robert and Jane (Weeks) Haslam and was born at Stone Cottage, Springfield, January 6th, 1864 and lived in this district his entire life, where by untiring efforts and always keeping abreast of the times, he became one of our island's most successful farmers; and as a breeder of high class pure bred Jersey cattle was widely known.

He was a man of keen intellect and very conversant of world affairs, a truly Christian gentleman, a staunch churchman, always ready and willing to give of his time and means for the advancement of Christ's kingdom, and for the good of the community.

He was licensed lay reader to St. Elizabeth's Church by the bishop in 1890, the duties of which he faithfully fulfilled. He was also superintendent of St. Elizabeth's Church School until failing health forced him to resign in 1933, he was a member of the Prince Edward Island Auxiliary of the Bible Society, he served on the executive and was for many years president of the Springfield branch.

On January 2nd, 1933, he was married to Lucy B. Palmer of "Ozendyke", DeSable, Prince Edward Island, who predeceased him three years ago. He leaves to mourn the loss of a kind and loving father, four sons and one daughter, namely Muriel and Reginald at home; Robert, Harrow, Ont.; Lloyd, Bridgetown, Ont. and James A., Charlottetown, P. E. I.

Six grand daughters and one grandson all in Ontario; also the following brother and sisters: Rev. Canon R. H. A. Haslam, Toronto, Ont.; Mrs. B. P. Oolough, New Market, Ont.; Matilda, Ada and Maude, all of Charlottetown. Mrs. B. W. Howard who recently passed away was a sister.
